The minutes for the previous meetings of January 24, 2005 were included in each Commission Member's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner Carter made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Layne to approve the minutes as submitted. The motion carried unanimously.

OLD BUSINESS

MAIN STREET REPORTS: Main Street Agency director, Melissa Staggs, presented a brief update on the Phase III of the Utility Relocation Project. The Project was on schedule.

CITY ENGINEER'S REPORTS: Charles Byers representing Summit Engineering, City Engineers, presented a verbal status report regarding the Indian Hills Sewer Extension Project. Mr. Byers advised the contractor, M & S General Contracting has begun work on the project.

CITY ATTORNEY'S REPORTS: Rusty Davis presented the following Ordinances for consideration:

1. Speed Limit: Presented and given second reading was an Ordinance captioned as follows:

ORDINANCE SETTING SPEED LIMIT ON HAMBLEY BOULEVARD BETWEEN ITS INTERSECTIONS WITH JULIUS AVENUE AND HUFFMAN AVENUE WITHIN THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE AT 25 MPH

3. Request to accept Joint Planning Commission approval for curb cut for the Food City Store located on Hambley Boulevard. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to accept. Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for further discussion, there being none the motion was passed unanimously.

CITY MANAGER'S REPORTS: Donovan Blackburn, City Manager, requested a closed session for the purpose of discussing a personnel matter and a legal matter concerning economic development. City Manager Blackburn recommended the approval to add New E-Mail Policy to the City of Pikeville Personnel Policy Manual for the City. Commissioner Layne made the motion, seconded by Commissioner Carter. Mayor Justice called for further comments, there being none the motion passed unanimously. City Manager Blackburn requested the approval to transfer the ownership of City Property to Frank Bailey and Frank Bailey Property to the City of Pikeville. Commissioner Davis made the motion to approve. Commissioner Carter seconded the motion. Mayor called for further discussion, there being none the motion passed unanimously.

City Manager announced that the City of Pikeville will be hosting a Kentucky League of Cities seminar on Tuesday March 15, 2005 from 9 am-4 pm at the Pikeville Fire Training Facility, 104 Chloe Road. The subject of the seminar will be Abandoned, Blighted and Tax Delinquent Properties.

There being no further business to come before the Commission, Commissioner Davis made the motion to adjourn. Commissioner Hall seconded the motion. The motion carried unanimously.
