Stratton, Councilman, duly seconded, an ordinance creating and establishing a Board of Health for the City of Pikeville, was placed upon its passage; thereupon the mayor ordered the Clerk to take the yeas and nays vote of the Councilmen present upon the adoption of said ordinance, which being done resulted as follows: Lauck Williams, yeas; T.M. Peery, yeas; W. Hackney, yeas; P.B. Stratton, yeas. Thereupon a majority of the Councilmen present having voted yeas, said ordinance was declared adopted.

Upon motion of T.M. Peery, duly seconded, the following three persons were appointed as members of the Board of Health of the City of Pikeville, viz: T.G. Parker, A.E. Ausier and Hi Pauley, and the Clerk is hereby ordered to notify said Parker, Ausier and Pauley of their appointment as members of said Board.

A.E. Ausier, T.G. Parker, and Hi Pauley, who having been appointed by the City Council, as members of Board of Health for the City of Pikeville Ky, presented themselves and took the oath as such members, as required by law.
