At a regular meeting of the City Council, held at its regular meeting place in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, on Monday, May, 4th 1914, at 7 o'clock P.M. D. T. Keel Mayor, ^{and} the following Councilmen present: Messrs: Geo. W. Hackney, T. M. Peery, P. B. Stratton, Linton Trivitt, Lauck Williams ^{and} Will C. Yost, "Absent none."

Minutes of last meeting was read ^{and} approved by the Council.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held at its regular meeting place on Monday, the 4th day of May, 1914, were present, D. T. Keel, Mayor, T. M. Peery, Will C. Yost, Lauck Williams, P. B. Stratton, Geo. W. Hackney, & Linton Trivitt, Councilmen.

The Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, do ordain as follows:

That there is granted a permit to Robert M. Thornsbury, the right ^{and} privilege of operating a peanut roaster ^{and} popcorn papper about two feet wide, ^{and} three ^{and} one half feet long, on wheels, on the public streets ^{and} alleys of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, with the restriction so as not to unreasonably obstruct said sidewalks ^{and} streets, or make same unsafe or unfit for public use, This permit is to take effect from ^{and} after its passage.

Thereupon, Mr. T. M. Peery, introduced ^{and} moved the passage ^{and} adoption of the following Ordinance, making ^{and} ordering corrections in street improvement bonds of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, issued under authority of Ordinance, of November 4th December, 2nd, 1912 ^{and} Ordinance of August 6th, 1913, ^{and} said motion to adopt said Ordinance being duly seconded by Mr. Linton Trivitt, ^{and} the same having been read in full ^{and} duly considered, the Mayor directed the Clerk to call the roll for a vote on the adoption of said Ordinance, directing those in favor, of same to vote "aye" ^{and} those opposing "no" Thereupon, the Clerk called the roll ^{and} the following members of the board voted "aye" ^{and} "no" as respectively shown: Mr. Hackney, "aye" Mr. Peery, "aye" Mr. Stratton, "aye" Mr. Trivitt, "aye" Mr. Williams, "aye" Mr. Yost, "aye" Nays, none.

Thereupon the Mayor announced that said ordinance received the vote of at least two-thirds of this Board, ^{and} the same was ^{and} is now declared to be adopted ^{and} passed as an ordinance of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, ^{and} the same is directed to be published ^{or} posted in the manner required by law.
