An ordinance amending an ordinance adopted Nov. 10th 1913, regulating the running & spending of bicycles, motorcycles & automobiles was adopted changing the jail sentence to a fine of \$10⁰⁰.

Came J.S. Blinn & J.D. Francis presented an ordinance to license bicycles, motorcycles & automobiles or any auto-vehicle and a bond of \$2000. required for all except bicycles, which ordinance was passed by a roll call of the vote which is as follows,
