

At a regular adjourned meeting of the City Council convened and held at the City Hall in the City of Pikeville Ky, on Tuesday June 9th 1914. J.M. Williams Mayor and the following Councilmen present, Linton Tribett, Lank Williams, W.C. Gost & W.H. Hackney.

On motion of Geo. H. Hackney duly seconded by Lank Williams the ordinance adopted licensing and bonding motorcycles and automobiles and other motor vehicles, was repealed by a unanimous vote of the Council, which ordinance stands repealed.

Clerk is directed to notify W.T. Burnett, Clean the lower end of Third street of such stuff as accumulated there by the use and operation of machinery etc in getting sand up the bank.

Clerk is directed to notify J.P. Munner to keep the sand and building material in such way as not to obstruct the street where he is building on said street.

The Mayor directed Lank Williams & F.C. Scott to look after the cleaning of these special places of the streets and also to procure a place to be used as stray pen for the impounding of Cows, Hogs, etc.

On report of supervisors is accepted and ordered filed and upon motion duly made and carried, the city clerk is hereby ordered to turn over to F.C. Scott, Chief of Police, the tax books for year 1914, containing 506 Tax tickets amounting to \$6,773.46 for collection and take his receipt therefor.

The Clerk reported that he was administering street bonds by following notice.

Sealed bids will be received at the office of the City Clerk of the City of Pikeville, State of Kentucky, until Twelve o'clock noon of Monday, July 13th, 1914, for street improvement bonds of said City, as follows:

Said bonds to be issued in the denomination of Five Hundred dollars each, except, as to the part of the total of each series remaining over and above multiples of five hundred dollars; all bonds to bear date October first, 1913, and to bear interest as evidenced by coupons attached at 4 1/2 percent, per annum

from date of bonds, interest payable semi-annually, each series of bonds indicated to mature as nearly to one-twentieth each year, beginning with October first 1914, as five hundred dollar denomination will permit. City however reserving option to redeem all or part on October first, 1914, or October first of each year thereafter. Bonds and interest payable at first National bank, Pikeville, Kentucky. Bonds cannot be sold for less than par, and accrued interest. Bids must state what series as above indicated that bids apply to, and the gross amount of bid and accrued interest to date of delivery, and must be accompanied by a certified check, payable to the treasurer of the City, in an amount equal to at least two percent, of amount bid for, upon condition that if bid is accepted the bidder will receive and pay for bonds mentioned in bid, within ten days from date of award. Bonds are secured by first lien on property improved, as provided in Kentucky statutes applying to citizens of fourth class.

Bids should be enclosed in envelopes marked "Bid for street improvement bonds" and addressed to the undersigned, Pikeville Kentucky.
