In pursuance of your order made at regular meeting of June 1st 1914. I advertised for sale the street improvement bonds mentioned in said order, by giving notice of said sale in Cincinnati Enquirer of June 16th and June 20, 1914. and in Manufacturers Record, Baltimore, Maryland, June 18th, 1914. also by posting in three public places in City of Pikeville: all of which notices were given in the form set out in the minutes of your meeting of June 9th 1914.

For said bonds I received prior to noon of July, 6th 1914, one bid that of Kelly Bros, of Portsmouth Ohio, which bid was accompanied by certified check for \$1120.00 said bid offers par and accrued interest for each of all of said bonds -- a total of \$55,778.90 and accrued interest to date of delivery.
