It is ordered that the board of health for the City through <sup>and</sup> by the City Clerk, order \$50.00 worth of antitoxine for the cities <sup>to</sup> to be furnished the doctors or by their written orders, to be charged to them at actual cost of said medicine, said antitoxine to be left in the care of the City Clerk or some member of the board of health, or with some one for convenience at all times for the doctors, said medicine to be paid for when delivered, ~~at~~ actual cost.
