

At a regular meeting of the City Council held in the City Hall in the City of Pikeville Ky, Oct. 5 1914.
Hon. J.M. Williams Mayor, and the following Councilmen present
P.B. Stratton, T.M. Beery, Land Williams and Linton Trivett.

Settlement of L. Dye Chief of Police was presented to the council which was accepted and ordered filed and recorded.

Settlement with R.L. Miller Police Judge was presented to the council same was not accepted. and was passed for further investigation.

The City Clerk is directed to notify W.T. Curmuth, to keep the sand &c. piled up at Bell Morris on Scott Ave. so that the traveling public will have a free passway at all times, and to clean the curbed stone &c. from main streets in front of Court house.

The City Clerk was directed to turn over to L. Dye Chief of Police the tax books for the City for year 1914, and take his receipt therefor. which was done.

T.G. Parker had tendered his ^{written} resignation as member of the City board of health to take effect at once. which was taken up by the council voted on and carried and accepted.

W.W. Hackney had tendered his written resignation as member of the board of Council which was taken up by the Council in the usual way and accepted.

T.G. Parker was put in nomination for councilman to fill the vacancy caused by the resignation of W.W. Hackney. no other nominations. The roll call of the vote stands as follows:

The City Clerk is hereby directed to notify the Sandy Valley Telephone Co. The Big Sandy Light & power Co. and the Eastern Ky. Telephone Co. that the City of Pikeville Ky. will use their poles for the purpose of tacking their street signs on and if the above named companies or either of them has any objections to it they will make complaint to the City Council in open meeting Oct. 12-6-30 A.M. 1914.

Ordered that Robert Williams be and he is allowed the sum of \$3.50 for plowing 1. Day on road.

Ordered that The Bradley & Gilbert Co. be and it is allowed the sum of \$17.00 for civil docket for Police Court.

Ordered that Lando Scott be and he is allowed the sum of \$4.00 for fixing sewer.

Ordered that H.C. Lipscomb & Co be and it is allowed the sum of \$3.50 for street signs for the city per bill filed
