At an adjourned meeting of the City Council held in the city in Pikeville Ky. on Oct. 19, 1914. Hon. I.M. Williams, Mayor and the following Councilmen present: T.B. Parker, O.B. Stratton, Lank Williams, Linton Trivett and F.M. Peery.

On motion of O.B. Stratton duly seconded by T.B. Parker, J.D. Francis is nominated to fill the vacancy occurred by the resignation of T.B. Parker as city board of health. The vote of the Council was unanimous in favor of Mr. Francis. Thereupon J.D. Francis was declared elected to fill said vacancy.

On motion of O.B. Stratton duly seconded by F.M. Peery, and carried by the usual vote of the Council. The O.P. Raymond Construction Co. is thereby granted a permit to run South and Elm streets for handling building material in constructing a Public School building, provided that said construction Co. will at all times leave at least ten feet clear of any and all obstructions on the south or opposite side of said streets.

It appearing from proof that J.T. Gevedon has been erroneously assessed for taxes for year 1914, with \$2100⁰⁰. It is ordered that said J.T. Gevedon be and he is hereby exonerated from paying city tax on twenty one hundred dollars worth of personal property at 75⁰⁰ per hundred, amounting to \$15⁷⁵.

Ordered That, L. Dye have credit on his tax book for year 1914, for \$15⁷⁵ amount of J.T. Gevedon's exoneration.

Ordered That, Dr. H.M. Alexander & Co. be and is allowed the sum of \$38⁰⁰ for antitoxin by order Dr. J.A. Thompson to date, for city use.

Ordered That, Bob Repass be and he is allowed the sum of \$15⁰⁰ for distributing and tacking up street signs and house numbers for city.

Ordered That, Ella R. Keel be and she is allowed the sum of \$9³⁰ for storage room for lime for the city.

Ordered That, H. Banley be and he is allowed the sum of \$37⁰⁶ per accounts filed.
