At a call meeting of the City Council of the city of Pikeville Ky. each member of the council being duly served with notices to meet at T. B. Parkers Store in the city of Pikeville Ky on Jan. 21<sup>st</sup> 1915. J. M. Williams Mayor and the following members present, Linton Trivett, W. C. Gost, Lark Williams, T. B. Parker.

The object of this meeting is to receive <sup>and</sup> accept the resignation of P. B. Stratton as councilman. <sup>and</sup> nominate and elect another to fill the vacancy. and to consider the repealing the stock law. <sup>and</sup> to take care of such other business as might come before the board under said call meeting.

The written resignation of P. B. Stratton as councilman was presented. <sup>and</sup> on motion duly made <sup>and</sup> seconded said resignation was accepted. by the unanimous vote of the Council.

By the resignation of P. B. Stratton a vacancy occurred in the City Council. Thereupon Linton Trivett. put in nomination to fill said vacancy. J. R. Johnson. seconded by W. C. Gost. <sup>and</sup> there being no further nominations. the vote was taken as follows. Linton Trivett "aye". T. B. Parker "aye". Lark Williams "aye". W. C. Gost "aye". said J. R. Johnson. was declared elected member of the City Council of Pikeville Ky.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to have 300 notices printed and distributed to citizens of Pikeville notifying them that the cow law has not been repealed <sup>and</sup> that after Sunday Jan. 24<sup>th</sup> 1915 all Cows running at large inside the corporation will be put up in stray pen.

On motion made by Linton Trivett. duly seconded by W. C. Gost. The ordinance of date July 27 1914. Licensing dogs vs. is hereby repealed. by unanimous vote of the Council.

On motion of Linton Trivett duly seconded by W. C. Gost. an ordinance was introduced prohibiting the Jockeying Horse ~~stopping~~ Trading within the corporate limits of the city of Pikeville Ky. <sup>and</sup> fixing a penalty <sup>therefor</sup>. A call of the vote stands as follows:
