This contract made and entered into by and between the city of Pikeville Ky. of the first part and William Clark, City Street Cleaner, party of the second part; Witnesseth: That said William Clark for and in consideration of the sum of Fifty five (\$55⁰⁰) per month due and payable at the end of each month, has this day agreed and by these presents doth agree to Clean, Sprinkle, Sweep and carry away the refuse and to do any and every act to be done in carrying out the duties to be performed by the City Street Cleaner for the City of Pikeville Ky. by virtue of the ordinance of the said City adopted on the 6th day of April, 1915. said ordinance being referred to and made part of this contract.

It is understood and agreed that this contract includes the cleaning of catch-basins and all work required to be done under above cited ordinance, and is to cover a period of Twelve months, from this date.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the city council convened and held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville Ky on May 10th 1915. Hon. J.M. Williams Mayor and the following councilmen present. T.G. Parker, J.H. Johnson, Linton Trivett, Lank Williams & W.C. Gant.

On motion duly made and carried the following board of supervisors was appointed. P.F. Truster, M.G. Bowles & Dick Thompson, same being property owners as the law requires to supervise the tax lands for year 1915.

An ordinance fitting the tax levy for year 1915 was presented and adopted by a unanimous vote of the Council for the rate of taxation at 75^{cts} on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property inside the corporate limits of the city of Pikeville also \$1.50 poll tax on each and every male citizen over 21 years of age living inside the corporation.

By unanimous vote of the Council an ordinance is adopted known as motor cycle ordinance, requiring a bond of \$10.00 and bond of \$200.00 before any one is allowed to operate a motor machine for private use in the city of Pikeville.
