

At a call meeting of the common council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened by written call by the Mayor, which written call was duly executed upon each member of the Council as shown by the proper officers return thereon, held on the 27th day of October 1915, in the City hall, the regular meeting place of said Council, there was present: J.M. Williams, Mayor, J.R. Johnson, J.S. Cline, W.E. Gost, Linton Trivett, T.M. Peery and Lauck Williams, Councilmen.

The object of this meeting is to consider the setting of a telephone ^{and to direct the sale of same} and telegraph franchise, and to regulate salaries of the officials of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky for the term beginning January, 1916.

Whereupon, Lauck Williams Councilman, introduced an ordinance creating a proposed telephone and telegraph franchise, over, along and across the streets, alley, public roads and highways and public places in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, to be granted by the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, to the purchaser thereof and on motion said ordinance is ordered to lay over until the next regular meeting of the City Council to be held on November, 1915.

An ordinance was introduced by J.S. Cline, Councilman directing the sale of the rights, privileges, franchise and authority set forth in the ordinance creating the proposed telephone and telegraph franchise, introduced by Lauck Williams, and appointing H.S. Dammorn, City Clerk, Commissioner to make sale of said proposed telephone and telegraph franchise as set forth in said ordinance, and the adoption of said ordinance being moved by J.S. Cline and being seconded by Lauck Williams, and the yeas and nays being ordered on the passage of said ordinance the vote was as follows:

and thereupon said ordinance was declared passed.

Whereas: there was an ordinance introduced in the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 27th day of Oct. 1915, creating a proposed telephone and telegraph franchise, including the right, franchise, privilege and authority to erect and operate a telephone and telegraph system, including telephone and telegraph lines, exchange for local and long distance service and all necessary poles, fixtures, wires and electric conductors upon, along, over and across the streets, alley, highways, public roads and public places of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for a period of twenty years from and after the date of said ordinance. And the said City of Pikeville, Kentucky, being desirous of selling said proposed franchise, rights and privileges, as set forth in said ordinance, now therefore this ordinance appointing a Commissioner for the purpose of making said sale to the highest and best bidder at public outcry,

The Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, do ordain as follows:-

Sec. I. That the right, privilege, franchise and authority to operate and maintain a telephone and telegraph system including an exchange for local and long distance service in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for a period of twenty years, from and after this date under the terms, conditions and limitations set forth in an ordinance setting forth a proposed telephone and telegraph franchise, introduced in the City Council of Pikeville, Kentucky, on the 27th day of October, 1915, be sold at public outcry to the highest and best bidder by the Commissioner herein after appointed and named to make said sale,

Sec. II. That H.S. Dammorn, City Clerk, be and he is hereby appointed as Commissioner to make said sale of the telephone and telegraph franchise, rights and privileges set forth in the above mentioned Ordinance.

Sec. III. That the said Commissioner before making said sale shall advertise the time, place and terms and conditions of said sale, and the nature of the franchise, rights, privileges and authority offered for sale by the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and for the purpose of making the said sale and advertising the rights, privileges, franchise and authority, offered for sale, a copy of the proposed ordinance creating said franchise, rights, privileges and authority to operate a telephone and telegraph system in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, copy said proposed ordinance as a part of the advertisement authorized and required herein.

Sec. IV. That said commissioner shall make said sale after 5 days notice by advertisement thereof by printed or posted notices in at least three public places in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, giving the time, place, terms and conditions of said sale, including the nature of the franchise, rights, privileges and authority, to be sold at said sale. The sale shall be for cash in hand, and the commissioner shall not receive any bid for less than \$50.00. The city of Pikeville reserves the right to reject any or all bids.

Sec. V. The said commissioner is allowed the sum of \$10.00 for making said sale and he shall report his acts herein at the next regular meeting of the city council of Pikeville, Kentucky, to be held on the first day of November, 1915.

Sec. VI. This ordinance shall be in full force and effect, from and after its passage and approval by the mayor and publication as required by law.
