The reading of the minutes was read and approved as the law requires.

The settlements made with Chief of Police was presented to the Council for approval, same was approved by the board and ordered recorded in the proper book.

The settlement of Police Judge was presented to the board of Council for approval, same was accepted and approved and ordered recorded in the proper book.

The claim of Bradley & Gilbert Co. of \$30.25 dating back to 1907, was presented to the Council, and same was rejected.

Passie City Atty Geo. Pinson Jr. and presented an ordinance prohibiting loafing & loitering around Depot in the City of Pikeville Ky, same was approved and ordered Copied & Pasted as the law requires.
