

At a regular meeting of the City Council convened and held in the City Hall on Apr 3<sup>rd</sup> 1916. Hon. A. Jackson Mayor and the following councilmen present, J.M. Coleman, J.D. Meade, J.L. Morgan, J.M. Triplett & P.F. Ouston.

The minutes of last meeting was read, accepted and approved.

The settlement of Chief of Police Sidney Trivitt was presented to the Council. same was accepted and approved and ordered recorded in the proper book.

The settlement of Police Judge Robt L. Miller was presented to the Council. same was accepted and approved and ordered recorded in the proper book.

G.C. Maynard presented claim of \$53.50 as balance due for services as deputy Police for March, 1916, and a roll call of the vote was demanded, which is as follows:-

P.F. Ouston & J.M. Triplett voting "no". J.D. Meade, J.M. Coleman & J.L. Morgan voting "yea" resulting in 3 votes for the claim and 2 against it. Therefore the claim stands allowed.

J.H. Adkins came before the Council and asked the Council to have a sewer laid on Mill Street, on motion same was referred to the Street Committee for investigation.

An ordinance, termed an ordinance creating the office of deputy Police, and fixing salary therefor, was introduced before the Council, and same was passed by a roll call of the vote which is as follows:

J.M. Coleman	voting	"yea"

J.D. Meade	"	"yea"

Resulting in 4 votes for and 1 against. Thereupon the ordinance was declared passed and ordered copied and posted as the law requires.

Thereupon the name of G.C. Maynard, <sup>(was put in)</sup> nomination for the office of deputy Police, and also the name of R.C. Huffman was put in nomination for same office, and a roll call of the vote was demanded, which is as follows: J.M. Coleman, for Maynard, J.D. Meade for Maynard, J.L. Morgan for Maynard, P.F. Ouston and J.M. Triplett for Huffman, resulting in 3 votes for Maynard and 2 votes for Huffman. Therefore Maynard was declared elected deputy Police.

Thereupon G.C. Maynard presented himself and took the oath of office as Deputy Police, as required by law.

Geo. Pinson Jr. committee appointed to settle suit of Tom Brown for damages for street running through his, filed his report showing that he settled said suit for \$100.00 and the cost of the action, which report was approved and committee discharged.

Judge R.L. Miller, having filed suit against the Council of the City of Pikeville, and asked that a mandatory injunction be granted him requiring the Council to allow him at the rate of \$60.00 per month for his services as Police Judge, and the pleadings having been made up, and proof taken on the merits, and the cause being tried before the Hon. J.F. Butler, Judge of the Pike Circuit Court, which resulted in a judgment declaring the ordinance void fixing his salary at \$400.00 per year, and declaring the ordinance of Sept. 7<sup>th</sup> 1915, fixing his salary at \$60.00 per month, valid, and directed the said Council to issue warrants to said Miller at \$60.00 per month for the remainder of his term. It is ordered by the Council that the City Clerk allow to said Miller, his salary at \$60.00 per month, until the expiration of his term, or until further orders of the Council.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to order a broom for the street sweeper, of the Williams contractor supply co of Columbus Ohio.

Ordered that Robt L. Miller be and he is allowed the sum of \$60.00 as salary as Police Judge for March 1916.

Ordered that Sidney Trivitt be and he is allowed the sum of \$75.00 salary as Chief Police for March 1916.

Ordered that Sidney Trivitt be and he is allowed the sum of \$13.50 for caring for fire hose, 3 months at \$2.50 pr month, and feeding prisoners in Lockup, March, 1916.

Ordered that G.C. Maynard be and he is allowed the sum of \$53.50 bal of claim due for services as deputy Police for March, 1916.

On motion duly made and carried the city aty was directed to draw up an ordinance reducing the license on theatres from \$50<sup>00</sup> per year to \$25.<sup>00</sup> per year.

On motion duly made and carried the City aty was directed to draw up an ordinance reducing the license on pool or billiard tables from \$25.<sup>00</sup> on each table per year to \$25.<sup>00</sup> on the first table and \$5.<sup>00</sup> on each additional table per year.

The city aty was also directed to prepare an ordinance to require all the resident property owners to top the sewer for water closets & out buildings whenever it is possible to do so.

The following resolution was passed by the Council, requesting the Mayor to set apart such day as he thought best for Clean-up, thereupon the Mayor set apart the 17, 18 & 19 days of Apr. 1916 as Clean up days for the City of Parkville Mo. The Mayor was also directed to pay for the hauling of all the garbage, refuse and rubbish placed in barrels or boxes convenient for teams to get to on those days out of the City treasury.
