

At a regular meeting of the city council of the city of Asheville, N.C. convened and held in the City Hall on May 1<sup>st</sup> 1916. Hon. A. Jackson and the following councilmen present: J.M. Tuflett, O.F. Creston, J.M. Coleman & J.D. Meade.

The reading of the minutes of last regular meeting was omitted.

The city atty presented the following ordinances which was agreed upon and voted on at last regular meeting and said city atty was directed to <sup>have</sup> same prepared and ready to be approved at this meeting, which was done.

An ordinance regulating theatres and fixing a license therefor was presented, read, accepted and approved.

An ordinance regulating Bowling alleys, Pool Tables and billiard tables, and fixing a license therefor was presented, read, accepted and approved.

An ordinance requiring all property owners, to connect their water closets with the public sewer, when it is practicable to do so was presented, read, accepted and approved.

An ordinance fixing tax levy for year 1916, of \$1.50 per capita, and 75¢ on the \$100 worth of taxable property, was presented, read, accepted and approved.

H.S. Dameron City Clerk filed his report of settlement with Chief of Police for Apr. 1916. same was accepted and ordered recorded in the proper book.

H.S. Dameron City Clerk, filed his report of settlement with Police Judge Robt L. Miller for month of April 1916. same was accepted and ordered recorded in the proper book.

On motion duly made and seconded the following persons was selected as a board of supervisors to equalize the taxable property of the Incorporated City of Asheville N.C. for year, 1916. H.H. Pinson, M.H. Bowles and Richard Thompson, and the Clerk was directed to notify said parties of their appointment.

Geo. Dinson Jr. City Atty. presented an ordinance authorizing contract sweeping sprinkling & cleaning the streets & alleys of the City of Asheville N.C. and defining specifications for the work, together with additional penalty for placing or causing to be placed garbage on the sidewalks, streets & alleys therein. said ordinance was adopted by the following yeas and nays vote. J.M. Triplett, voting "yea" O.F. Preston voting "yea" J.D. Meade voting "yea" J.M. Coleman, voting "yea" Virgil Forsythe & J.H. Morgan, being absent. all members present voting for the adoption of said ordinance thereupon same was declared enacted and approved.

The Council reserving the right to reject any and all bids and it appearing to the Board of Council that all the bids received was too high, and on motion duly made and seconded all the above named bids was rejected.

The Clerk was directed to readvertise for bids on the sprinkling, sweeping & cleaning of the streets of the City of Asheville N.C. as per ordinance of May 1<sup>st</sup> 1916. Same to be filed with the City Clerk, not later than 6:30 P.M. Thursday May 11<sup>th</sup> 1916.
