

At an adjourned meeting of the City Council of the City of Pikeville Ky. held in the city hall. May 11 1916. Hon. A.J. Jackson Mayor and the following Councilmen present, J.M. Triplett, J.M. Coleman, J.D. Muade, & J.L. Morgan.

Hi Pauley tendered his written resignation as member of the Board of Supervisors for the City of Pikeville Ky. same was accepted and said Hi Pauley was released from said board.

By reason of the resignation of Hi Pauley as supervisor a vacancy was made in said Board. Thereupon the name of H.H. Elliott was put in nomination to fill said vacancy and by unanimous vote of the Council H.H. Elliott was elected to fill said vacancy and said H.H. Elliott was declared a member of the board of Supervisors.

The following bids was received and read before the board of Council for sweeping and cleaning the streets of Pikeville, Ky. Robert Williams \$100 per month Sherman Carter \$78 John A. Beatty \$50 L.H. Whitman \$98 or under contract of 1914 \$75 Lauck Williams \$79 per month. said Lauck Williams being the lowest bidder and on motion of J.D. Muade duly seconded. the contract was awarded to Lauck Williams.

Came Lauck Williams and accepted the contract as Street Cleaner and entered into bond as such with approved surety. which bond is in words and figures as follows:

"Bond"

We, Lauck Williams, Street Cleaner of the City of Pikeville, Ky. Principal and Joe Williams, H.M. Hoskins & John H. Heathley, his sureties, hereby covenant to and with the City of Pikeville, Ky. in the sum of Five hundred dollars (\$500) that the said Lauck Williams, as Street Cleaner aforesaid, will faithfully perform all the duties incumbent upon him as such Street Cleaner aforesaid, according to the terms of the contract this day entered into between him and the said City of Pikeville Ky. and the terms and specifications, contained in the ordinance creating the said office of Street Cleaner aforesaid and should he said Lauck Williams, fail to comply fully with said contract and ordinance, then and in that event we will forfeit and pay to the said City of Pikeville, Ky. the sum of \$500.

Ordered That,

Lauck Williams, be and he is allowed the sum of \$2.92 for freight paid on broom. May 9 1916.

Ordered That,

The Austin-Western Road Machinery Co. be and it is allowed the sum of \$25 for 1. shickory broom for Austin sweep.

On motion Geo. Cinson Jr. City Atty was directed to bring condemnation proceedings against Libby Waller to obtain right of way through her property to build new street.

Ordered That,

Chief of Police assist A.J. Younger with two or three men in putting road in repair from dormitory around near the Waller property. The said Younger to furnish side number of hands to assist in said work at his own expense.

Ordered That,

The Austin-Western Road Machinery Co. be allowed interest on their claim of \$585.34 from ^{Dec 1 1915} ~~the date~~ at 6% and the Clerk is directed to issue a warrant to them bearing to them at said rate, when the original warrant is returned to him for cancellation.

Whereas Margaret Clevinger has heretofore been directed by ordinance to build a side walk in front of her property on Ky. avenue and whereas she has failed to comply with said ordinance. It is now ordered that said side walk be built by the City of Pikeville, Ky. Cost of which shall be charged up to said Margaret Clevinger, with a lien retained on her said lot for the cost of said building. and the Clerk of the City of Pikeville, Ky. is ordered to let to contract the building of said side walk to the lowest and best bidder.

But before he proceeds to let said contract he will advertise the time of said letting for at least ten days prior to same by written or printed notices posted in at least three public places in the City of Pikeville Ky. one to be posted on said lot. The said contract shall be let in front of said lot. The said Contractor to give bond in the sum of an amount equal to double the amount of his said bid for the faithful performance of said contract. The said Clevinger has the right to bid on said contract, and if she does, she shall have preference over all other bidders provided she gives the required bond. said bond to be approved by the Council.

Contract.

This contract made and entered into by and between Land-Williams party of the first part, and the City of Pikeville Ky. party of the second part.

Witnesseth: That whereas, the party of the second part did on the 11 day of May 1916, let to contract, the sweeping, sprinkling, and cleaning the streets and alleys of the City of Pikeville, Ky. for the period of one year from this date, and

Whereas, the party of the first part was the lowest and best bidder at the price of \$79.00 per month; and whereas the said party of the second part has accepted said bid of the party of the first part, and awards to him the contract of sweeping, sprinkling, and cleaning the said streets and alleys of the City of Pikeville, Ky. for the period of one year from this date.

Now therefore, in consideration of the sum of \$79.00 per month, the said party of the first part hereby agrees and binds himself to sweep, sprinkle, and clean the streets of the City of Pikeville, for the period of one year from this date according to the terms and specifications of the ordinance authorizing the contract for the same, which ordinance was approved May 1 1916. An attached copy of which ordinance is attached hereto, and made a part of this contract, and said party of the first part, agrees to comply fully with all the terms and specifications of said ordinance, and this contract.

Should the said party of the first part fail to comply with the terms of this contract and ordinance, in any particular, then and in that event, this contract shall become null and void, and of no binding effect.

The said sweeping, sprinkling and cleaning of said streets and alleys shall be under the supervision of the Street-committee and the Chief of Police, of the City of Pikeville Ky.
