

Contract.

This contract made and entered into by and between Land-Williams party of the first part, and the City of Pikeville Ky. party of the second part.

Witnesseth: That whereas, the party of the second part did on the 11<sup>th</sup> day of May 1916, let to contract, the sweeping, sprinkling, and cleaning the streets and alleys of the City of Pikeville, Ky. for the period of one year from this date; and

Whereas, the party of the first part was the lowest and best bidder at the price of \$79<sup>00</sup> per month; and whereas the said party of the second part has accepted said bid of the party of the first part, and awards to him the contract of sweeping, sprinkling, and cleaning the said streets and alleys of the City of Pikeville, Ky. for the period of one year from this date.

Now therefore, in consideration of the sum of \$79<sup>00</sup> per month, the said party of the first part hereby agrees and binds himself to sweep, sprinkle, and clean the streets of the City of Pikeville, for the period of one year from this date according to the terms and specifications of the ordinance authorizing the contract for the same, which ordinance was approved May 1<sup>st</sup> 1916. An attached copy of which ordinance is attached hereto, and made a part of this contract, and said party of the first part, agrees to comply fully with all the terms and specifications of said ordinance, and this contract.

Should the said party of the first part fail to comply with the terms of this contract and ordinance, in any particular, then and in that event, this contract shall become null and void, and of no binding effect.

The said sweeping, sprinkling and cleaning of said streets and alleys shall be under the supervision of the Street-committee and the Chief of Police, of the City of Pikeville Ky.

Motion was made that a committee be appointed to investigate and report whether or not H.C. Maynard has been guilty of drunkenness while on duty as deputy Police and thereupon the Mayor appointed the following J.H. Morgan + J.M. Triplett to report Saturday June 17 1916.

P.H. Day, entered motion to have sewer mains opened up through and past his property in the city of Pikeville Ky. for his own use and upon vote being taken J.H. Morgan + J.D. Meade voting "yes" P.F. Preston + J.M. Triplett voting "no" resulting in a tie thereupon the Mayor voting no the motion was defeated.

H.M. Hopkins presented a petition signed by two-thirds of the property owners on the avenue asking to have the street repaved and on motion the Council agreed to go upon the ground and investigate the matter and report.

An ordinance was introduced regulating the sale of Cider or any kind of malt, near beer or any drink similar to or tasting like beer whether the same be intoxicating or not and fixing a license + penalty therefor. said ordinance was passed by unanimous vote of the Council.

An ordinance was introduced and passed by unanimous vote of the Council. Prohibiting the drinking of Vinous, malt or any kind of intoxicating liquors in any lunch room, Restaurant, Store or other public place within the corporate limits of the city of Pikeville Kentucky. and providing a penalty therefor.

The City Atty. was directed to draw up an ordinance striking off Boundary of the City limits as originally defined by ordinance.

Lark Williams be and he is allowed the sum of \$79.00 for cleaning the streets for May, 1916. Warrant to be issued to First Nat Bank as per order filed.
