The object of this call meeting was meeting is to take bond of Chief of Police as tax collector, if further bond be necessary and to take care of such other business as might necessarily come before the Board of Council.

It is ordered that the Mayor and P. F. Preston be and they are hereby appointed as committee to see the City atty and employ an other attorney if necessary, to look up the case of J. A. Dilore vs City of Pikeville, and have same copied and reported or appealed to the Court of Appeals, as soon as possible.

On motion duly made and carried, the following report of Committee as to the conduct of G. C. Maynard Deputy Police, while on duty as such, be received, and said committee is relieved from further duty as such.

W. E. J. L. Morgan & J. M. Triplett, Committee appointed to investigate and make a report as to whether G. C. Maynard, Deputy Police, has been guilty of being drunk while on duty as Deputy Police.

They to make the following report. From the general rumor of the citizens that said G. C. Maynard has been intoxicated while on duty as a Deputy Police of the City of Pikeville Ky.

At a call meeting of the City Council for the City of Pikeville, Ky. held in the City hall on July 29<sup>th</sup> 1916.  
Hon. A. J. Jackson, Mayor and the following Councilmen present,  
J. M. Coleman, J. L. Morgan, J. M. Triplett, P. F. Preston & J. D. Meade.

The object of this call meeting is for the purpose of selecting a deputy Police and taking care of other business pertaining thereto.

The resignation of H. C. Maynard, as deputy police of the City of Pikeville, Ky. which was filed with the City Clerk on July 21<sup>st</sup> 1916, was presented to the Board of Council, and motion of J. L. Morgan duly seconded. It is ordered that said resignation be accepted. And that on the next regular meeting of this Council, such amount as is due said Maynard for services rendered will be allowed.

The applications of R. C. Huffman & E. B. Coleman for the office of Deputy Police for the City of Pikeville Ky. was presented & read to the Board of Council, and after some consideration, a roll call of the vote was ordered, which is as follows:-

Virgil Forsythe	absent,	

Resulting in 4 votes for Coleman, 1 vote for Huffman thereupon, by reason of Coleman receiving the greatest number of votes same was declared elected as Deputy Police.

An Ordinance termed an ordinance, regulating the removal of the Deputy Police, was presented and passed by unanimous vote of the Council and ordered posted as the Law requires.

On motion the Board of Council is adjourned until Regular meeting, 7<sup>th</sup> day of Aug, 1916, at 7 o'clock P.M.
