An ordinance fixing the salary of the Deputy Police ^{per month} was introduced and passed by the following vote of the Board of Council.

J.D. Meade voting yea; J.M. Coleman voting yea; J.L. Morgan voting yea; J.M. Triplett voting no. P.F. Ouston and Virgil Gooch being absent. Thereupon the ordinance was declared passed.

E.B. Coleman tendered his resignation as Deputy Police for the City of Pikeville Ky. same was accepted by the Board of Council.

On motion of J.D. Meade duly recorded, the name of E.B.C. was put in nomination for the office of Deputy Police for the City of Pikeville Ky. there being no other nomination thereupon the vote being taken in the usual way was unanimously elected Deputy Police, and wa

On motion the Mayor is appointed to investigate the sewer at L.M. Swinn residence and the necessary repairs made to control the water in same.

It is ordered that as many catch basins be put in Ky. Avenue as will properly drain said avenue same to be done according to the City Engineer's instructions. and also all ditching necessary to carry the water to said basins.

On motion it is ordered that Laudo Seatt & Co and he is hereby employed to put in the catch basins and do such ditching as is necessary for the proper drainage of the water on Ky avenue, by the directions of the City Engineer. said Seatt is to have \$3⁰⁰ per day for his services.
