The reading of the minutes on motion was omitted until next regular meeting.

The clerk's report of settlement made with Chief of Police was approved by the Board and ordered recorded in the proper book.

It is ordered that the City Clerk purchase for the City a good Horse cart.

Mr. Jesse Cash presented himself before the Board of Council and made a proposition as follows, that John Adkins and himself would build a retaining wall or butment at the head of the alley running from 14th Avenue up by the said John Adkins to the Will Smith line and dig the ditch and lay the sewer in good shape and under the supervision of the City authorities, provided the city would furnish the sewer tile and material to do the work.

On motion duly made and carried, it is ordered that the City of Asheville furnish to said Cash + Adkins as soon as possible all the material necessary to do the work mentioned in the preceding order.

Hon. H. M. Hoskins came before the Board of Council and proposed to haul and cover the street up 14th Avenue with Cinders, provided the city would pay \$15⁰⁰ to help pay the expenses of the work and he would pay the remainder of the expenses of the work.

On motion duly made and carried the City Clerk is directed to ^{pay to} the proper person or persons, the amount of \$15⁰⁰ when the work is completed.

Ordered that the City Clerk notify all persons who was not assessed by the City Assessor for taxes for the year 1916, to appear before the Board of Council at its next regular meeting Jan. 1917 and show why if they have any reasons why their property should not be assessed for taxation for year 1916.
