A.J. Akers be and he is allowed the sum of \$10⁰⁰ for salary as Councilman for Jan. Feb. March Apr & May 1917.

On motion of J.D. Meade duly seconded, by J.M. Coleman an ordinance was introduced providing for the keeping of hogs in the corporate limits of the city of Pikeville Ky. under certain conditions & restrictions. J.D. Meade, J.M. Coleman, J.M. Triplett, & A.J. Akers. Voting for the ordinance and J.L. Morgan not voting. P.F. Crutson absent. The City attorney was directed to prepare the said ordinance.

A.J. Akers tendered his written resignation as member of the Board of Council for the city of Pikeville Ky. same was accepted by the Board and said Akers was released from further duty as Councilman.

There being a vacancy in the Board of Council by reason of the resignation of Mr. A.J. Akers. J.D. Meade put in nomination the name of I.C. Clevinger to fill said vacancy. Said nomination was duly seconded. There being no further nominations the vote was taken in the usual manner. I.C. Clevinger was elected by unanimous vote of the Board, and was so declared.

A.J. Akers, being the only bidder for the contract of sweeping and cleaning the streets of the city of Pikeville Ky. on motion of J.D. Meade duly seconded, the contract was given to said Akers, at the price mentioned in his bid, of \$106⁰⁰ per month, for 12 months from the 11th day of May 1917.

Said A.J. Akers, executed bond in the sum of \$500⁰⁰ for the faithful performance of his duty as said "Street Cleaner" with Tom Williamson as his surety, same was approved, by the Mayor, said Bond by oversight was recorded on page 186 of this record book, should have followed in regular order.

On motion of J.L. Morgan duly seconded, A.J. Jackson, Mayor, Sidney Triplett Chief of Police & J.M. Triplett, was appointed as Committee to see that the contract with the "Street Cleaner" is strictly complied with.

Contract.

This contract made and entered into by and between A.J. Akers party of the first part and the City of Pikeville Kentucky, party of the second part.

Witnesseth: That whereas the party of the second part did on the 7th day of May 1917, let to contract the sweeping, sprinkling and cleaning of the streets and alleys and catch basins of the city of Pikeville Ky, for the period of one year from May 11th 1917, and whereas the party of the first part was the lowest and best bidder at the price of \$106⁰⁰ per month, and whereas the party of the second part has accepted said bid of the party of the first part and awards to him the contract of sprinkling, sweeping and cleaning the said streets, alleys and catch basins of the said City of Pikeville, Ky, for the period of one year from May 11th 1917.

Now in consideration of the sum of one hundred and six dollars per month, the said party of the first part hereby agrees and binds himself to sprinkle, sweep & clean the streets and catch basins of the said City of Pikeville, Ky, for the period of one year from May 11th 1917, according to the terms and specifications of the ordinance authorizing the contract for the same, which ordinance was approved, Apr. 19th 1917. An attested copy of said ordinance is attached hereto and made a part of this contract, and said party of the first part agrees to comply fully with all the terms & specifications of said ordinance and this contract.

Should the said party of the first part, fail to comply with the terms of this contract and ordinance, authorizing the same in any particular, then and in that event, this contract shall become null & void and of no binding effect. The said sprinkling, sweeping and cleaning of said streets, alleys and catch basins shall be under the supervision of Mayor A.J. Jackson, J.M. Triplett and Chief of Police Sidney Triplett of the said City of Pikeville Ky. This May 11th 1917.
