

At a call meeting of the Board of Council held in the City Hall on May 16th 1917. Hon. A. Jackson Mayor and the following Councilmen present. J.M. Coleman, J.M. Triplett, J.D. Meade, & I.C. Clevinger.

The object of this call meeting is to appoint a Board of Supervisors for the City for year 1917, by reason of the regular appointed Board refusing to serve.

J.M. Coleman moved to appoint the following men; Jno. A. Bentley, N. Starkey & J.M. Morris, as a Board of Supervisors of the City for the City of Pikeville Ky for 1917. Said motion was duly seconded, there being no further motions before the Board, said Jno. A. Bentley, N. Starkey and J.M. Morris, was duly elected Supervisors and was so declared, and the City Clerk was directed to notify the said Bentley, Morris & Starkey of their appointment.

There being no further business to transact on motion Council was adjourned.

Sanction

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of Council for the City of Pikeville Ky held in the City Hall, May 21st 1917. Hon. A. Jackson Mayor and the following Councilmen present. J.D. Meade, J.M. Triplett, J.M. Coleman & I.C. Clevinger.

Report of sale of Gas Franchise.

I. H. S. Dameron Commissioner appointed by the Board of Council on the 8th day of March 1917. To make sale of a Gas Franchise, for the City of Pikeville Ky. Beg. to report that on the 19th day of March 1917, at the hour of 12-15 O'clock P.M. after notice being duly posted as required by law, of said sale proceeded to sell same to the highest and best bidder for cash in hand, at the front door of the Court house in the City of Pikeville Ky. R.H. Cooper bidding the sum of \$17⁵⁰ for said franchise; there being no other bids, the same was thrown off and sold to R.H. Cooper he being the highest and best bidder, for the sum of \$17⁵⁰ which sum was paid to the said Commissioner by check of R.H. Cooper. All of which is respectfully reported.

Whereas, an ordinance was duly adopted on March, 8th 1917 providing for the sale of the right and privilege to lay and maintain pipe in and under the streets, alleys, and public ways of the City of Pikeville, for the purpose of conducting and transporting gas, for a period of Twenty (20) years, and said sale having been duly advertised as provided by said ordinance, and H.S. Dameron, City Clerk, who was appointed City Commissioner to make said sale, having made his report of said sale herein, which is now approved and confirmed, and R.H. Cooper, having become the purchaser thereof at said sale, he being the highest bidder therefor.

Therefore, be it ordained by the Board of Council of the City of Pikeville Ky.

1. That the bid of R.H. Cooper, as aforesaid, be and the same is hereby accepted and confirmed and there is granted unto the said R.H. Cooper, his successors and assigns, the right and privilege to lay and maintain pipe in and under the streets, alleys and public ways of the City of Pikeville, for the purpose of conducting and transporting gas, subject, however, to all the provisions and conditions of said ordinance, adopted March, 8th 1917, relative thereto, and the purchaser or assigns, shall not charge a greater sum than thirty (30) cents per 1000 cubic feet, for gas used, and to complete the laying of pipe lines for the distribution of gas in the City of Pikeville Ky, within three years from this date.

And to furnish light and heat for the Council Chamber of the City Hall, free of all charge to said City of Pikeville.

And all Ordinances, parts of ordinances or contracts made in conflict with this ordinance are hereby repealed.

2) This ordinance shall be in full force and effect from and after its passage and publication.

The above ordinance was introduced by R.H. Cooper, and on motion of J.D. Meade, Councilman duly seconded by J.M. Coleman, the said ordinance was passed, by a roll call of the vote as follows:

All members present voting aye, said ordinance carried by unanimous vote, and so declared.

On motion, it is ordered that City of Pikeville, pay for the lowering and removing the dirt from the alley between F.J. Hatcher and Ernest and Violet Walker property.

On motion, the street committee is directed to investigate the condition of existing the barn of Lida E. Hillier and have same remedied if they think it proper to do so.

On motion of J.D. Meade duly seconded, it is ordered that A.B. Cochran, be and he is hereby excommunicated from paying a city license for selling spectacles in the corporate limits of the City of Pikeville Ky. for and during his natural life.

On May the 7th 1917, an ordinance known as the Hog ordinance was introduced and passed by the majority of the members of the Board of Council present. Said ordinance was vetoed by the Mayor, A.J. Jackson, which is as follows:

To the Hon. City Clerk and City Council of the City of Pikeville,

You are hereby notified that I as Mayor of said City, refuse to approve or sign and by this do veto the ordinance passed at the last regular meeting of the City Council known as the Hog law or ordinance permitting all persons in the corporate limits of said City to keep hogs within 75 ft. of any residence or houses of business for the following reasons:

- 1st That it is contrary to the welfare of the Statebrook of health.
- 2nd That it renders the City unsanitary and is at a time of the year when liable to create an epidemic of fever etc.
- 3rd That the distance of 75 ft. is not a sufficient distance to insure a safe and sanitary conditions.
- 4th That the passage of said ordinance would create a nuisance in the City, and is not passed in good faith for the welfare and benefit of the public.

The above ordinance known as the Hog ordinance after having been vetoed by the Mayor of the City of Pikeville Ky. was presented to the Board

of Council for approval and passage. Same was approved and passed by a roll call of the vote which is as follows: J.M. Triplett, voting "aye". J.M. Coleman, voting "aye". I.C. Cleverly voting "aye". J.D. Meade voting "aye". J.L. Morgan and P.F. Prestero absent, The result being 4 for its passage. 2 absent. Thereupon the ordinance was passed, and so declared.

On motion Council was adjourned until 7 o'clock P.M. June 4th 1917.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Council held in the City Hall, June 11th 1917. Hon. A.J. Jackson Mayor and the following Councilmen present, J.M. Triplett, J.D. Meade. There not being a quorum to transact business, said meeting was adjourned until 7 o'clock, P.M. June, 11th 1917.
