

At a regular meeting of the Board of Council for the City of Pikeville Ky. held in the City Hall on the 3<sup>rd</sup> day of Sept. 1917. Hon. A.J. Jackson, Mayor, and the following Councilmen present. O.F. Weston, J.D. Meade, J.M. Triplett & S.C. Clivinger,

Report of Sidney Trivitt, Chief of Police, received & filed and ordered recorded in the proper book.

An Ordinance was passed regulating the hauling of dirt &c. on the streets and alleys of the City of Pikeville Ky.

An Automobile Ordinance was passed regulating the operation and running of automobiles &c. in the corporate limits of the City of Pikeville Ky.

All Ordinance was introduced and passed requesting, ordering and directing the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Co. to install and construct all underspacial crossing under its railroad bed at or near the mouth of Frances Hollow and Kentucky Avenue, and also to construct and install a sufficient Sewerage System under its said rail road bed at or near the mouth of said Hollow and Avenue sufficient in size and quality to take care of and carry away the surface water from said Hollow, and Avenue.

All Ordinance was passed requiring the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Co. to construct and install a sewer under its said bed at or near Jim Englands sufficient in size and quality to take in and carry away all surface water gathering at said place.

Ordered That J.B. Clime be and he is allowed the sum of \$150<sup>00</sup> for rent of house for city hall and Police station upto Jan 1<sup>st</sup> 1918.

Ordered That Sandy Valley Telephone Co. be and it is allowed the sum of \$98<sup>00</sup> for services upto Oct. 17<sup>th</sup> 1917.

Ordered That James Rathbiff be and he is allowed the sum of \$10<sup>00</sup> for laying sewer in sixth street.

Ordered That The Pike County News be and it is allowed the sum of \$17.75 for printing done for the city to date.

Ordered That Sidney Trivitt be and he is allowed the sum of \$137<sup>00</sup> for salary as Chief of Police for Aug. 1917, also for flushing fire plugs and commission of collecting taxes for the city.

Ordered That H.S. Darrison be and he is allowed the sum of \$85<sup>50</sup> for salary and services as City Clerk for July + Aug 1917.

Ordered That E. B. Boheman be and he is allowed the sum of \$70<sup>00</sup> for salary as Deputy Police for Aug. 1917.

Clevinger "yea", J. M. Triplett "yea". All the votes being in favor of said ordinance the same was declared passed.

Vote on drainage under Railroad at High Street and Austin Avenue resulted as follows. J. M. Triplett "yea", J. M. Coleman "yea", I. C. Clevinger "yea", J. D. Meade "yea". All voting in favor of same the same was declared passed.

On motion S. M. Cecil was granted permission to tear down the shed where the street sweeper and water wagon is kept and stack the lumber in good condition.
