At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of Council for the City of Asheville N.C. held in the City Hall on the 20th day of December, 1917. Present J. L. Morgan, Mayor. Councilmen F. F. Rattliff.

Personally appeared W. C. Call, Frank A. Connolly, Lem Duty, J. J. Stone and A. L. Eldredge who having been duly elected as members of the Board of City Council, at the preceding Nov. election 1917 and took the oath of office as the law requires.

On motion duly carried. It is ordered that all persons doing work for the City under and by the order of the Chief of Police, shall file with the Chief of Police and have same attached to the draft issued to them an affidavit showing the number of hours or the number of days worked and the correctness of said claims. This shall be done before being signed by the Mayor.

On motion duly carried. It is ordered that a committee be appointed to investigate the City Lock up and to ascertain what is best to be done in the matter, whether to overhaul and repair the old one or to procure a suitable site for a new one and to calculate the cost of same as near as possible to do so. Also to prepare a suitable place to take care of the Cities property, such as Sweepers, Sprinkling wagon, etc.

The Mayor in accordance to said order, appointed Will C. Call, F. F. Rattliff and Frank Connolly as members of said committee.

On motion duly carried. It is ordered that a pardon board be appointed as the law requires and the Mayor in accordance to said motion hereby appoints J. J. Stone and Lem Duty to act in conjunction with the Mayor on said Board.

On motion duly carried. It is ordered that a Board of health be appointed. Thereupon in accordance to said motion, the Mayor appoints J. J. Stone, Will C. Call and Frank Connolly as members of said Board to take up the matter and carry out same as the law requires of such Board.

A. L. Rattliff appeared before the Board of Council and took the oath of office as City Attorney, according to law, after having filed his Certificate of election at Nov. election 1917. with said Board.

On motion duly carried, it is ordered that Geo. S. Thornsbury, City Treasurer, pay to First Nat. Bank of Pikeville, for Kelly Brothers, the sum of \$2415.⁰⁰ for interest coupons on street paving bonds for year 1917, same was inspected by the Board of Council and was burned in their presence.

On motion duly carried it is ordered that Geo. S. Thornsbury, City Treasurer pay to First Nat Bank of Pikeville for Kelly Brothers, the sum of \$3350.⁰⁰ for the following street paving bonds-

E. B. Coleman appeared in open meeting and took the oath of office ^{for Chief of Police} as required by law after having filed his certificate of election with said Board.

J. F. Morgan presented himself before the Board of Council in open meeting after having filed his certificate of election with said Board, and took the oath of office for Mayor of the City of Pikeville Ky. as the law requires.

On motion duly carried H. S. Dammorn is hereby appointed to make settlement Geo. S. Thornsbury City Treasurer for year 1917, as to general funds.

On motion duly carried H. S. Dammorn is hereby appointed to make settlement with Sidney Fairbrother, Chief of Police, for year 1917.

Ordered That John Smith be and he is allowed the sum of \$20.⁰⁰ for guarding the C. & O. Depot, 10 days.

Sidney Fairbrother who was duly elected Police Judge at Nov. election 1917, for the City of Pikeville Ky. appeared before me H. S. Dammorn City Clerk, and produced his commission as such Police Judge the said commission having been filed by the Clerk of the Pike County Court, and noted of record on the order of said Pike County Court as filed and took oath of office as required by law.

On motion Council is adjourned until 7 o'clock, January 7, 1918

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Council held in the city hall on the 11th day of January, 1918, Hon. J. F. Morgan, Mayor, and the following Councilmen present: W. P. Call, J. J. Stone, F. H. Connolly, Lem Dutz, J. F. Rattley and Alex Elliott.

The minutes of the preceding meeting was read and approved, by the Board of Council. Came E. B. Coleman, who was duly elected Chief of Police at Nov. election 1917, and executed bond to the City of Pikeville Ky. in the sum of Twenty Five (\$2500.⁰⁰) Dollars with The United States Fidelity & Guaranty Co. of Baltimore Md. as his surety which bond was accepted by the Board of Council and approved by the Mayor and attested by the City Clerk.

Coleman who was duly elected Chief of Police for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, at the November election 1917, shall well and truly discharge all the duties of said office, pay over and account for all money or property, which may come into his hands as said Chief of Police, to the proper person or persons, entitled to receive same according to law.
