At a regular meeting of the common council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall on the 2nd day of September, 1918, the following were present: Mayor, J. F. Morgan, and councilmen, Alex Elliott, R. Thompson, G. F. Childers, F. F. Ratliff and W.P. Call, and J. C. Cleinger.

The minutes of last four meetings were read and approved.

Ordered that

Lamundo Scott be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$4⁵⁰ for fine bags of cement for sewer at Francis Hollow.

Ordered that N. Starkey be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$8⁶⁵ for telephone service to Octobre 1st, 1918, and

long distance calls of chief of police.

W.P. Call moved that the account of Oscar Layne of \$14⁷⁵ for work on sewer at Pike Grocery Company on third street be allowed. R. Thompson seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: W.P. Call, yes; R. Thompson, yes; G. F. Childers, yes; Alex Elliott, yes and F. F. Ratliff, no. As a majority voted yes the mayor declared said motion passed and directed that said account be paid.

W.P. Call moved that the C. O. O. Railway Company be notified to clean their catch basin at the foot of Elm street regularly, F. F. Ratliff seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Ordered that J.M. Hatcher be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$38⁵⁰ for salary and services for month of August, 1918, as city clerk.

G. F. Childers moved that the report of the committee hereunto appointed to investigate and report as to the necessity and legality of offering for sale a lighting franchise for the city of Pikeville be accepted, R. Thompson seconded said motion. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Cleinger, no; G. F. Childers, yes; R. Thompson, yes; W.P. Call, yes; Alex Elliott, no; and F. F.
