The minutes of the last meeting were read and approved.

Ordered that

Mrs. Lida E. Wellier be and she is hereby allowed the sum of \$25⁰⁰ for rent for stray pen for city from October 16, 1917, to October 16, 1918.

Ordered that

Sandy Valley Light & Power Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$475⁹⁰ for light for city's use and supplies for quarter ending Sept 30, 1918 (being July, August and September, 1918).

The city clerk's settlement with police judge for month of September, 1918, was filed, received and approved.

The mayor appointed F. F. Ratliff, W. P. Calk and city attorney G. L. Ratliff as a committee to investigate conditions of street or road &c at residence of George Hamms and report at the next regular meeting of the city Council.

W. L. Morris presented an account for \$116⁹⁰ for printing &c done for city and the mayor appointed J. C. Clevinger, the city clerk and the city attorney as a committee to investigate said claim.

J. C. Clevinger introduced an ordinance entitled an ordinance allowing the police judge a certain sum of money, to wit \$25⁰⁰ per month, for clerk hire to be used as he sees necessary and moved that same be passed. Councilman F. F. Rutledge introduced an ordinance proposing the sale of a franchise for the lighting of the streets of the city of Pikeville with electricity and furnishing same to the inhabitants thereof. J. C. Clevinger seconded said motion, and upon consideration thereof the Council directed the same to be sold to the highest and best bidder, as required by law, by the following "aye" and "no" vote.

Alex. Elliott, "aye"
W. P. Call "no"
F. F. Rutledge "aye"
J. C. Clevinger "aye"

A majority of the Council present voting "aye" the Mayor declared said motion passed.

F. F. Rutledge moved that J. M. Hatcher, the city clerk, be appointed special Commissioner to make said sale. J. C. Clevinger seconded said motion which carried unanimously.

The Mayor appointed J. M. Hatcher, special Commissioner, to make said sale, which he is directed to do after duly posting and advertising said ordinance as is required by law. He will report his acts hereunder on the 21st day of October, 1918, to which time said ordinance is ordered to lie over. Said Commissioner is allowed the sum of \$10.00 for making said sale. A copy of said proposed ordinance may be found in the files of the city clerk.

J. C. Clevinger made the following motion:

"Whereas a disease known as Spanish influenza is raging over the country, the Council orders all schools, churches, theaters, pool rooms, all public gatherings and all unnecessary congregations be stopped until the danger of said influenza has passed; and the city Council further directs that the police force enforce the same. The police force is given authority to summon such assistance from the citizens as they may need. People affected by the above order and all others will govern themselves accordingly."

F. F. Rutledge seconded said motion, which carried unanimously. The Mayor declared same passed and directed the city clerk to make certified copies of above order or motion for all churches, schools, pool rooms, theaters and all public gatherings, to be executed on them by the city chief of police, which was done.

upon motion made and duly seconded Council is adjourned until October 21st, 1918.
