 Second: That all persons who have contracted influenza are required to stay in their own houses or rooms until given permission to leave same by the physician in charge of the City Board of Health.
 Third: That all funerals be private and that only such persons be allowed to attend same as are necessary.
 Fourth: That all children under 16 years of age not employed in a useful occupation and all others not employed be prohibited from congregating upon the streets and other public places in and about the city of Pikeville.
 Said children moved that said ordinance be passed, which was seconded by Alex Elliot, said motion carried unanimously and the Mayor declared said ordinance passed.

Upon motion made and duly seconded Council is adjourned until tonight, at 7 o'clock P.M., October 21st, 1918.
