CITY OF PIKEVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING MINUTES March 26, 2018 AT 6:00 P.M.

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, March 26, 2018. The meeting was held in the City Hall Meeting Room located at 243 Main Street, Pikeville, Kentucky 41501.

There being a quorum present, Mayor James A. Carter called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Commission Members present at roll call were as follows:

MINUTES

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on March 12, 2018 were in each Commission Member's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Jimmy Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion carried unanimously. 5-0.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Art Herr of 256 Scott Avenue came forward to discuss the Pikeville Pond with the Mayor and Commissioners. Mr. Herr says that he has lost approximately 13 feet of grassy area near the pond and will not take the lawnmower near the area. Assistant Fire Chief Robby Lindsey says that the Pond is high because of the rain and the Corp, we cannot feed into the river right now. We have had the extra rain so it is higher. Mr. Herr asked if there was a way to get rock down to the area to maintain what is there. Mr. Slone says that he and the City Manager have been communicating with the Corp on this to help get a plan to maintain.

Pike County Emergency Management discussion regarding an all-weather drone. CJ Childers was present and representing the Pike County Emergency Management team and says that he would like to enter into a partnership for an all-weather drone. The cost per entity would be \$7,500.00, which is a third of the cost including the County, the City and Coal Run. Mayor Carter asked for information on this and explains that it will need to be discussed. Mr. Childers explained the drone's abilities and trainings and certifications required to operate the machine. Mayor says that he would like to discuss further when City Manager is back. City Attorney says that he would also like to discuss an MOA amongst everyone and Mayor agreed.

PAYMENT OF CITY BILLS

The Deputy City Manager of Operations Brad Slone requested the approval to pay city bills in the amount of \$1,904,048.28. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

CITY ENGINEER

Brad Slone was present and submitted several requests to the commission for approval.

Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 2. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Invoice No. 3750 to Integrated Engineering for \$9,090.00, as submitted, for the downtown streetscape master plan. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

- 5. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Invoice No. 6121 to Jigsaw Enterprises, LLC for \$9,500.00, as submitted, for the Cecil Hills Drive drainage repair project. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 6. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Pay Request 7 to Judy Construction Company for \$1,019,751.57, as submitted, for the WWTP upgrade project and grant the Deputy City Manager of Operations authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

CITY ATTORNEY

Russell Davis was present and had the following items to read into record.

Consider a second reading of Ordinance No. 0-2018-06, as submitted, amending Section 158 of the City of Pikeville Code of Ordinances providing for a logging permit and permit application fee and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute said ordinance on behalf of the City of Pikeville. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, Mayor called roll call.

Mayor Carter called for comments and says that UMG does a great job and we know that you exceed the contract. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 3. Consider a request to authorize and approve the purchase of property at 224 Julius Avenue and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Mr. Slone adds that this is the Vanover property. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 4. Consider a request to authorize and approve a Construction Agreement with Commonwealth Building & Construction Company, Inc., as submitted, for \$3,600.00 for repairs to the roof the Rustic Roots building, authorize and approve issuance of a Notice to Proceed, and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 5. Consider a request to authorize the issuance of an advertisement for public bids for property located at 289 Sycamore Street. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. - 6. Consider a request to authorize and approve voluntary payroll deductions from employees for Supporting Heroes, a non-profit public safety personnel support organization.
