CITY OF PIKEVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING MINUTES April 9, 2018 AT 6:00 P.M.

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, April 9, 2018. The meeting was held in the City Hall Meeting Room located at 243 Main Street, Pikeville, Kentucky 41501.

There being a quorum present, Mayor James A. Carter called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Commission Members present at roll call were as follows:

MINUTES

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on March 26, 2018 were in each Commission Member's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Jimmy Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion carried unanimously. 5-0.

PAYMENT OF CITY BILLS

The City Manager Philip Elswick requested the approval to pay city bills in the amount of \$1,161,750.94. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

CITY ENGINEER

Brad Slone was present and submitted several requests to the commission for approval.

- 1. Consider request to approve and authorize payment pf OVIVO Invoice No. 8473374, as submitted, for \$416,044.30 for the wastewater treatment plant upgrade project. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 2. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Rising Sun Developing, Inc. Spec Building Package Pay Request 2, as submitted, for \$66,600.00. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 3. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Rising Sun Developing, Inc. Site Package Pay Request 3, as submitted, for \$97,501.50. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 4. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of AstroTurf Corporation Pay Request 3, as submitted, for \$189,099.62. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments and asked if that was everything. Mr. Slone explains that these two-pay requests will get us through the biggest bulk of it. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 5. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of AstroTurf Corporation Pay Request 4, as submitted, for \$31,942.30. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

CITY ATTORNEY

Russell Davis was present and had the following item to read into record.

1. Consider a first reading of Ordinance No. 0-2018-07, as submitted, renaming East Street to Scotty Hamilton Way. Second reading and passage of this ordinance will take place at next scheduled meeting. Mayor added comments following the reading that this very good idea originated with Commissioner Shurtleff, and the name change will allow the address to the Police Station to be 111 Scotty Hamilton Way.

CITY MANAGER

City Manager Philip Elswick presented the commission with the following items for approval:

- 1. Consider a request to adopt a proclamation honoring Pikeville Police Officer Scotty Hamilton and designating January 11 as Scotty Hamilton Day in the City of Pikeville and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute said proclamation on behalf of the City of Pikeville. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments and read the proclamation aloud. Commissioner Hartsock says that this is a small token that we can do and anytime we can help please let us know. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 2. Consider a request to authorize the retirement of Unit 111 of the Pikeville Police Department to honor Pikeville Police Officer Scotty Hamilton's service and valor. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Chief Edmonds thanked the commission for letting us retire this number. We placed his badge in the flag box today and we want that there for us and we thank you for letting us do that. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 3. Consider a request to adopt a proclamation recognizing and honoring the assistance provided by various police and fire departments and dispatchers during the City of Pikeville's time of need and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute said proclamation on behalf of the City of Pikeville. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Mayor says that Les Stapleton was there from beginning to end. Mayor Stapleton worked directly with his officers as they covered calls for the Pikeville Police Department by giving directions and information based on his experience in Pikeville as a KSP trooper. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 4. Consider a request to adopt a proclamation recognizing the Hillbilly Days Pig Drop event to support Shriners Hospital for Children and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute said proclamation on behalf of the City of Pikeville. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments and then read the proclamation aloud. Jimmy Kinney, a Shriners member, came forward and explained the Pig Drop event and thanked the Mayor for wanting to participate. Mr. Kinney says that the Hillbilly Day Event has donated close to \$3 million dollars to the Shriners Hospital. He says that Pike County has approximately 400 active patients that go to the hospital. He thanks the City for everything that they do to make the event successful. Mayor says the volunteers help make it happen. Commissioner May-Downey

- says that she has a daughter who was a Shriner kid and she would like to thank them personally for all that they do. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 5. Consider a request to assign Patrolman Russell Blankenship to the position of Sergeant at the 10-year rate of pay for said position based upon the recommendation of the interview committee and the City Manager. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Chief Edmonds says that Blankenship is a 12-year guy and that he cannot say enough about his work ethic. Officer Blankenship thanked his family for putting up with him and his schedule and thanked the Mayor, Commission and Mr. Elswick for the position. And then says that this is for Scotty. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 6. Consider a request to authorize the Human Resources Administrator to advertise for two Patrolmen for the Pikeville Police Department. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 7. Consider a request to authorize and approve an Amendment to the agreement with the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet, as submitted, for the Downtown Pikeville Bikeway Project and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. The amendment extends the expiration of the agreement to June 30, 2019. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 8. Consider a request to authorize and approve a Location & Logo release with Amusing Productions VI, Inc. for filming Carnival Eats Season 6 on April 20-21, 2018 and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 9. Consider a request to authorize and approve waiving of occupational taxes for Scotty Hamilton's March 30, 2018 and April 13, 2018 pay periods. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 10. Consider a request to authorize and approve a Federal Financial Report for the Economic Department Administration regarding funds associated with the wastewater treatment plant upgrade project and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

- 13. There being no further business to come before the Commission, Commissioner McNamee has made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the meeting was adjourned. 5-0.
