BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS  
REGULAR MEETING MINUTES  
June 25, 2018 AT 6:00 P.M.**

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, June 25, 2018. The meeting was held in the City Hall Meeting Room located at 243 Main Street, Pikeville, Kentucky 41501.

**MINUTES**

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on June 11, 2018 were in each Commission Member's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner May-Downey made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Jimmy Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion carried unanimously. 5-0.

**BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR**

Presentation by Jeff Vanderbeck. Mr. Vanderbeck approached the Mayor and Commission and introduced Danny Coleman, who is advertising director for the Appalachian News-Express and collects the "Best in the Valleys" which readers choose. In 2018, we have two plaques to present, one being to the family of Scotty Hamilton as Best Police Officer and the other for Chief Edmonds.

KWVOA Award. Donnie Slone and Greg May from UMG was present and wanted to announce the receiving of the Kentucky Waste Water Outstanding Performance Award of 2017 and show appreciation to their team for their achievement.

Denise Thomas updated the Mayor and the Commission on the Big Sandy project. Structural steel is in place. Exterior stud walls and brick should be arriving soon.

Due to numerous weather days, the contractor is requesting 41 days, which will put the project completion near the end of December. Also, the contractor is requesting \$6,074.00 due to unexpected large rocks found in the site and the work necessary to remove those. Mayor Carter made a motion to accept the requested change order. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor called for comments. Ms. Thomas adds that the next progress meeting will be July 11, 2018 at 10:30a.m. on campus with the project being about 33% complete. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

Dr. Sherry Zylka, also with Big Sandy Community and Technical College, expresses her thanks to the Mayor and Commission and says it is a joy to see the progress and see the community grow.

#### PAYMENT OF CITY BILLS

The City Manager Philip Elswick requested the approval to pay city bills in the amount of \$1,797,136.99. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

#### CITY ENGINEER

Brad Slone was present and submitted several requests to the commission for approval.

1. Consider request to approve and authorize payment of invoice no. 3874 for Integrated Engineering, as submitted, for \$3,333.50 for KEIP Spec Building Construction Services. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
2. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Pay Request 17 for Bush and Burchett, Inc. for \$405,238.05, as submitted, and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Mr. Slone adds that this is retainage from work completed throughout the contract period. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
3. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Invoice No. 3881 for Integrated Engineering, as submitted, for \$6,470.00 for the Julius Avenue Slide Stabilization Project. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion.

- Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
4. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Invoice No. 3882 for Integrated Engineering, as submitted, for \$6,837.50 for Bob Amos Park Events Center conceptual site plan. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  5. Consider a request to authorize and approve Change Order 7 for Bush and Burchett, Inc., as submitted, for \$20,067.00 for modifications to the Marion Branch Bridge Boat Ramp as recommended by Kentucky Department of Fish and Wildlife Resources and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Both Mr. Elswick and Mr. Slone agreed that they did a good job on this project. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  6. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of invoice no. 45 for Vaughn & Melton Consulting Engineers, Inc., as submitted, for \$30,426.19 for the WWTP Upgrade Improvement Projects and grant the Deputy City Manager of Operations/Engineer the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  7. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Pay Request No. 10 for Judy Construction Company, as submitted, for \$875,946.76 for the WWTP Upgrade Improvements Project and grant the City Manager and Deputy City Manager of Operations/Engineer the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  8. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Invoice No. 489-113 for H2O Construction Company, Inc., as submitted, for \$75,000.00 for the Poor Farm Lift Station Repair Project. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, Mayor called roll call.

**CITY MANAGER**

City Manager Philip Elswick presented the commission with the following items for approval:

1. Consider a request to award a bid to Redina Construction, Inc. for \$72.00/vertical foot for the manhole relining and repairs project and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Commissioner May-Downey asked if final cost was known. Mr. Elswick responded that we bid a total of 330 vertical feet. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
2. Consider a request to award a bid to Darrell Pugh for \$3,700.00 and development of 183 Julius Avenue into apartments, as submitted, and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents contingent upon approval of the re-zoning request for Julius Avenue. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. City Manager says that the development plan that was submitted was for this property and the property beside of it that Mr. Pugh currently owns. Commissioner May-Downey asked if there was a start date for this and City Manager says that the property has to be re-zoned before the development begins. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
3. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of EKB-TV Invoice No. 18050293 for \$595.00, as submitted, for promotion and advertising of the Farmers Market. This invoice will be paid with grant funds. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
4. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Appalachian Newspaper invoices for \$300.00 and \$336.00, as submitted, for promotion and advertising of the Farmers Market. These invoices will be paid with grant funds. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
5. Consider a request to authorize and approve a proposal from Integrated Engineering for \$74,700.00, as submitted, for surveying and engineering services associated with facilities at Bob Amos Park and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

6. Consider a request to authorize and approve a proposal from Consulting Services, Inc. for \$9,500.00, as submitted, for geotechnical services associated with facilities at Bob Amos Park and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents upon completion of negotiations by the City Manager and City Attorney. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
7. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment, upon passage of the 2018-2019 Fiscal Budget, KLC Insurance Services Invoice No. W5452-2018-16497-0 for \$249,513.49 for Workers Compensation Insurance, Invoice No. L5452-2018-17175-0 for \$301,773.21 for liability insurance and Invoice No. P5452-2018-17177-0 for \$136,619.09 for Property insurance, as submitted, and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments and Mr. Elswick added that this is the same coverage as last year but rates are a little higher. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
8. Consider a request to adopt a resolution approving execution of a Memorandum of Agreement with the Commonwealth of Kentucky, Transportation Cabinet, Department of Highways, in the amount of \$14,000,000.00 for the Marion Branch Industrial Park Access Road, as submitted, and grant the City Clerk the authority to sign and execute said resolution. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. City Manager adds that the City Clerk will certify that we adopt the resolution. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
9. Consider a request to authorize and approve an amendment to the City of Pikeville Pay Chart dated July 1, 2018, as submitted. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
10. Consider a request to appoint Robbi Bentley to the salaried position of Director of Utilities at the 2-year rate, Emily Fields to the salaried position of Grants/HR Administrator at the 5-year rate, and Jimmy Taylor to the salaried position of Director of Tourism at the 5-year rate. All appointments are effective July 1, 2018. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
11. Consider a request to approve adjusting hourly rates for all employees classified as Firefighters/EMTs and Fire Clerk based on the City of Pikeville Pay Chart dated July 1, 2018 using the standard cost of living adjustment of 2% per year for all employees with tenure longer than 5-years for the initial

- adjustment. All changes are effective July 1, 2018. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. City Manager explained that most City employees receive a 5% increase at their 10 year and 20 year anniversaries of employment rather than the standard cost of living raise of 2%. However, previous rate charts did not include the same 5% rate increase for police officers and firefighters/EMTs. In order to give all employees classified as firefighters/EMTs and the Fire Clerk the same raise across the board, the recently approved 5% increase at 10 years and 20 years will be neglected in calculating the new hourly rates for each firefighter/EMT and Fire Clerk that will be effective on July 1. Rather a 2% increase will be used for every year of service beyond 5 years. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
12. Consider a request to authorize the HR Administrator to advertise for the position of Police Records Administrator and authorize and approve the job description for said position, as submitted. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. City Manager adds that Ms. Campbell will be retiring near the end of the year and we want to get someone in the position with some time for training. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  13. Consider a request to approve issuance of an advertisement for public bid for asphalt and paving services for the remainder of the 2018 calendar year. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  14. Consider a request to authorize and approve an expiration date modification to the MOA with Commonwealth of Kentucky, Department for Natural Resources, Division of Abandoned Mine Lands for the Marion Branch Industrial Park speculative building, as submitted, and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  15. Consider a request to authorize and approve submittal of an Encroachment Permit application to the Kentucky Transportation Cabinet for repairs/upgrades to the drainage system at the intersection of Huffman Avenue and Bypass Road and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner May-Downey made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Mr. Elswick explains that this involves several drains with the state highway, but in order to correct the problem, the City will replace/upgrade all drainage structures as necessary – both those that are owned by the City and those owned by the state. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

16. Consider a request to authorize and approve the transfer of a 2008 Dodge S35 ambulance, VIN No. 3D6WH46A88G251084 to the Neon Fire Department for \$25,000.00 and grant the City Manager the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
17. Consider a request to accept a proposal from Clean Cut Services for \$4,400.00, as submitted, for removal of a tree in the pond below the 7<sup>th</sup> Street pedestrian bridge and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
18. Consider a request to authorize and approve issuance of an advertisement for public bids for the Pikeville Dispatch Center remodeling project. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Mr. Slone says that there will be a series of bids with this project of different items. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
19. Consider a request to accept a proposal from Faith Tree Services, LLC for \$8,950.00, as submitted, for removal of trees near City Hall and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Mr. Elswick says that the removal of these are necessary for the dispatch center project. Mayor called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
20. Consider a request to accept a proposal for fleet management services and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve awarding the proposal to Enterprise Fleet Management, the only bidder. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
21. Consider a request to award a bid to Richards Electric Supply, the low bidder, for \$7,725.00, as submitted, for fiber optic conduit to be installed at Kentucky Enterprise Industrial Park and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
22. Consider a request to award a bid to Consolidated Pipe, the low bidder, for \$72,090.50, as submitted, for 8-inch gas line to be installed at Kentucky Enterprise Industrial Park and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor



- Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
23. Consider a request to award a bid to Overhead Door, the only bidder, for \$27,500.00, as submitted, for fencing to be installed at Bob Amos Soccer Facility and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. Mr. Elswick says that this needs to be done ASAP. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  24. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of an invoice from the Appalachian News-Express, as submitted, for \$1,925.00 for printing of brochures for the Pikeville Farmers Market. The invoice will be paid with grant funds. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  25. Consider a request to authorize and approve a contract or use agreement with the Pike County Property Valuation Administrator's office to allow the City of Pikeville the use of its electronic property data in related software applications and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute all necessary documents upon the completion of negotiations by the City Manager and City Attorney. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments. City Manager says there will be no cost for this and Mr. Slone adds that our new software will use the data. Commissioner May-Downey also adds that it is all public information anyway. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  26. Consider a request to award a proposal to KVWV Traffic Control, Inc., as submitted, for \$13,319.04 for the striping of Thompson Road and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents upon completion of negotiations by the City Manager and City Attorney. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
  27. Consider a request authorize and approve a 5-foot encroachment on the utility easement along Walnut Drive by Jim Reynolds with confirmation that the City of Pikeville owns the easement area and Mr. Reynolds signature of a release of the City for any damages to improvements, structures, etc. included in the easement area should it be necessary to disturb the entire 10-foot easement area to access the utility lines and grant the Mayor the authority to sign any and all necessary documents. Commissioner Shurtleff made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously 5-0.
  28. Pursuant to KRS 61.810, consider request for closed session for discussion of economic development, legal and personnel issues. Commissioner McNamee

- made the motion. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
29. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to reconvene. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0. Mayor called the session back into order.
30. Consider a request to authorize issuance of a Request for Proposals for operation, maintenance, and marketing of ziplines, river trails, and horse barn. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
31. Consider a request to authorize and approve the proposal from BitSource, LLC for the #Appalachia Augmented Mobile Application for \$5,000.00, the Local Events Mobile Application creation for \$6,500.00 and \$75.00/hour for additional development, and \$35.00/hour for content entry, content entry for \$35.00/hour for the visitpikeville.com website, and a scoping study for the Hatfield & McCoy Augmented Reality Mobile Application of \$2,000.00 and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner May-Downey seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
32. Consider a request to authorize and approve issuance of a Letter of Commitment to the YMCA for the proposal pool project outlining the details as discussed and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute said letter. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
33. There being no further business to come before the Commission, Commissioner McNamee has made the motion to adjourn the meeting. Commissioner Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the meeting was adjourned. 5-0.

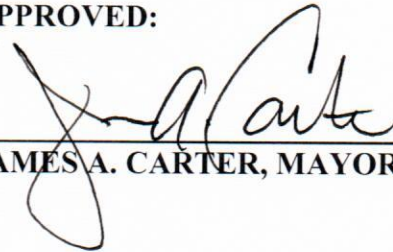

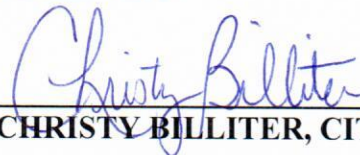
