CITY OF PIKEVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING MINUTES September 27, 2021 AT 6:00 P.M.

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, September 27, 2021. The meeting was held in the City Hall Meeting Room located at 243 Main Street, Pikeville, Kentucky 41501.

There being a quorum present, Mayor James A. Carter called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. Commission Members present at roll call were as follows:

MINUTES

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on September 13, 2021 were in each Commissioner's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Powers seconded the motion. Mayor Jimmy Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion carried unanimously. 5-0.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Former Mayor Frank Justice was present to discuss an issue related to a possible city street adjacent to his property in at Pauley Addition. The area in question is a short segment of Dogwood Street that has been used historically for a parking area. After discussing the issue, Mayor Carter stated there was no issue and the Commission is willing to remove the street from its system. The City Manager indicated that an ordinance would be drafted for the next Commission meeting. Mr. Justice stated he was would address any legal issues related the property following its removal from the city street system. Mr. Justice also requested that a 2 inch water line behind the property be relocated to run along Walnut Street. Donnie Slone of UMG was present and indicated that there should not be a problem with relocating the line but further investigation was needed.

PAYMENT OF CITY BILLS

The City Manager Philip Elswick requested the approval to pay city bills in the amount of \$1,074,227.14. Commissioner Hartsock made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for discussion, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

Brad Slone was present and submitted several requests to the Commission for approval.

- 1. Consider a request to authorize advertisement for bids for the Hambley Athletic Complex Artificial Turf Replacement project. Commissioner McNamee made the motion to approve. Commissioner Hartsock seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 2. Consider a request to authorize and approve Jigsaw Enterprises, LLC Change Order No. 1, as submitted, for \$10,440.00 and 107 days for the Pikeville Bikeways project and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents. Commissioner Powers made the motion to approve. Commissioner McNamee seconded the motion. Mayor Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 3. Consider a request to authorize and approve payment of Jigsaw Enterprises, LLC Invoice No. 7026, as submitted, for \$50,040.00 for the Pikeville Bikeways project and grant the Mayor the authority to sign and execute any and all necessary documents.
