## CITY OF PIKEVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS SPECIAL MEETING MINUTES January 26, 2011 AT 4:00 P.M.

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a special called session on Wednesday, January 26, 2010. The meeting was held in the City Hall Conference Meeting Room located at 118 College Street, Pikeville, Kentucky.

(1) There being a quorum present, Mayor Pro-Tem Jimmy Carter called the meeting to order at 4:00 p.m. Commission Members present at roll call were as follows:

- (2) The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on January 10, 2011 were in each Commission Member's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Pro-Tem Jimmy Carter called for discussion. There being none, the motion carried unanimously. 4-0.
- (3) The City Manager Donovan Blackburn requested the approval to pay city bills lists in the total amount of \$81,301.90. Commissioner Davis made the motion to approve. Commissioner Chaney seconded the motion. Mayor Pro-Tem Carter called for further discussion. There being none, motion passed unanimously. 4-0.
- (4) Consider a request for authorization to submit a funding application and for the Mayor to execute all document related to the Department of Homeland Security (DHS) Federal Emergency Management Agency's (FEMA) Fiscal Year 2010 Fire Prevention and Safety Grants program. The funding request includes training for fire and arson investigation with no match necessary. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve. Commissioner Layne seconded the motion.

Mayor Pro-Tem Carter called for comments. There being none, the motion passed unanimously. 4-0.

- **(5)** City Manager Donovan Blackburn made the request to review, discuss and award the submitted bid for the construction contract in the amount presented for construction work that shall be completed for the Texas Roadhouse site development and Item #6 development for Justice Way. The Texas Roadhouse site will include everything leading up to having the area ready including the parking lot, the lights, the blacktop, etc. Consider authorizing the mayor to sign and execute said construction contract as presented and issue the Notice to Proceed for said work. City Engineer Jack Sykes was present and recommended the bid be awarded to RL Construction. RL Construction was the overall low bidder coming in at \$821,830.00. The bid consist of two projects. Project one, Justice Way, was bid at \$287,700.00 and project two, Texas Roadhouse, was bid at \$534,130.00. Item #5 Texas Roadhouse at \$534,130.00 is the motion we are requesting first. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve. Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Pro-Tem Carter called for comments. Mayor Pro-Tem Carter asked if each of these were bid out separately. City Manager Donovan Blackburn explains that they were bid out separately. "The request of item #5 on your agenda is the award of \$534,130.00. Again, the total bid price \$821,830.00. There were two separate items and there were two separate prices. We had to bid them separately because one is taxable and the other is non-taxable. The request being to award RL Construction the overall contract of \$821,830.00." Mayor Pro-Tem Carter called for further comments. There being none, the motion passed unanimously. 4-0.
- (6) City Manager Blackburn made the request to review, discuss and award the submitted bid for the construction contract to RL Construction in the amount of \$287,700.00, with the understanding that the overall bid price of \$821,830.00 was the lowest bid price with both projects combined, presented for construction work that shall be completed for the Justice Way street development and to authorize the mayor to sign and execute said construction contract as presented and to issue the Notice to Proceed for said work. Commissioner Layne made the motion to approve. Commissioner Chaney seconded the motion. Mayor Pro-Tem Carter called for comments. There being none, the motion passed unanimously. 4-0.
- (7) Consider a request for the reading and passage of an emergency ordinance #0-2011-004 amending Chapters 115.07 and 115.12 of the Occupational License Fee Ordinance related to penalties for underestimating tax when an extension to file is granted. City Attorney Rusty Davis was present and read the ordinance aloud. He explains that all this ordinance does is change the way people estimate their taxes, they estimate their taxes 75 percent of what they are. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve. Commissioner Layne seconded the motion. Mayor Pro-Tem

Carter called for comments. There being none Mayor Pro-Tem called for roll call. The motion passed unanimously. 4-0.

AN ORDINANCE AMENDING CHAPTERS
115.07 AND 115.12 OF THE OCCUPATIONAL LICENSE
FEES ORDINANCE RELATING TO PENALTIES FOR
UNDERESTIMATING TAX WHEN AN
EXTENSION TO FILE IS GRANTED

#### **ORDINANCE NO. 0-2011-004**

**WHEREAS**, the Commission desires to further define/explain the taxpayers that are subject to penalty for failing to properly estimate tax due while filing a Application for Extension of Time to file net profits license tax returns.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED THAT Chapter 115.07 "EXTENSIONS" is amended to read as follows:

#### § 115.07 EXTENSIONS.

- (A) The city, or its authorized agent, may grant any business entity an extension of not more than six (6) months, unless a longer extension has been granted by the Internal Revenue Service or is agreed to by the city and the business entity, for filing its return, if the business entity, on or before the date prescribed for payment of the occupational license tax, requests the extension and pays the amount properly estimated as its tax.
- (B) If the time for filing a return is extended, the business shall pay, as part of the tax, an amount equal to twelve percent (12%) per annum simple interest on the tax shown due on the return, but not been previously paid, from the time the tax was due until the return is actually filed and the tax paid to the city. A fraction of a month is counted as an entire month.

- (C) The Penalty assessed a taxpayer under § 115.12 shall not be assessed on the difference between the tax due and properly estimated tax paid by the taxpayer upon granting of an Extensionpayment made with a properly filed "Application for Extension of Time to File Net Profits License Tax Return" under paragraph (A) if the

#### § 115.12 - Penalties

- (1) A business entity subject to tax on net profits may be subject to a penalty equal to five percent (5%) of the tax due for each calendar month or fraction thereof if the business entity:
- (a) Fails to file any return or report on or before the due date prescribed for filing or as extended by the city; or

properly estimated tax is 75% or greater than the tax due.

- (b) Fails to pay the tax computed on the return or report on or before the due date prescribed for payment or fails to pay 75% or greater of the tax due on the return as a estimated tax pursuant to § 115.07(A). For underestimated taxes paid for an Extension, the penalty will be accessed upon the difference of the estimated tax paid and the tax computed on the return.
- (c) The total penalty levied pursuant to this subsection shall not exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the total tax due; however, the penalty shall not be less than twenty\_five dollars (\$25).
- (2) Every employer who fails to file a return or pay the tax on or before the time prescribed under Section (5) of this ordinance may be subject to a penalty in amount equal to five percent (5%) of the tax due for each calendar month or fraction thereof. The total penalty levied pursuant to this subsection shall not exceed twenty-five percent (25%) of the total tax due; however, the penalty shall not be less than twenty-five dollars (\$25).

- (3) In addition to the penalties prescribed in this section, any business entity or employer shall pay, as part of the tax, an amount equal to twelve percent (12%) per annum simple interest on the tax shown due, but not previously paid, from the time the tax was due until the tax is paid to the city. A fraction of a month is counted as an entire month.
- (4) Every tax imposed by this ordinance, and all increases, interest, and penalties thereon, shall become, from the time the tax is due and payable, a personal debt of the taxpayer to the city.
- (5) The city may enforce the collection of the occupational tax due under section (3) of this ordinance and any fees, penalties, and interest as provided in subsections (1), (2), (3), and (4) of this section by civil action in a court of appropriate jurisdiction. To the extent authorized by law, the city shall be entitled to recover all court costs and reasonable attorney fees incurred by it in enforcing any provision of this ordinance.
- (6) In addition to the penalties prescribed in this section, any business entity or employer who willfully fails to make a return or willfully makes a false return, or who willfully fails to pay taxes owing or collected, with the intent to evade payment of the tax or amount collected, or any part thereof, shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
- (7) Any person who willfully aids or assists in, or procures, counsels, or advises the preparation or presentation under, or in connection with, any matter arising under this ordinance of a return, affidavit, claim, or other document, which is fraudulent or is false as to any material matter, whether or not the falsity or fraud is with the knowledge or consent of the person authorized or required to present the return, affidavit, claim, or document, shall be guilty of a Class A misdemeanor.
- (8) A return for the purpose of this section shall mean and include any return, declaration, or form prescribed by the city and required to be filed with the city by the provisions of this ordinance, or by the rules of the city or by written request for information to the business entity by the city.
- (9) Any person violating the provisions of section (11) of this ordinance by intentionally inspecting confidential taxpayer information without authorization, shall be fined not more than five hundred dollars (\$500) or imprisoned for not longer than six (6) months, or both. (10) Any person violating the provisions of section (11) of this ordinance by divulging confidential taxpayer information shall be fined not more than one thousand dollars (\$1000) or imprisoned for not more than one (1) year, or both. This ordinance shall be effective for the 2010 tax year for those taxpayer filing requests for extensions for the 2010 tax year and thereafter.
