

At a meeting of the city council of the city of Pitsville Ky. held in the city hall on the 13th day of nov 1917. in pursuance of an order of the Ogle Circuit Court on sept 28th 1917. requiring the said council to meet and lay a levy sufficient to pay off and liquidate a judgment in favor of Kelly Bros vs City of Pitsville Ky.

The following members of the council was present to vote:
J.L. Morgan, J.M. Triplett, J.C. Cleveringer, J.D. Meade & J.M. Coleman.

J.L. Morgan, was elected Mayor Protem. of said meeting the office of Mayor being vacant. by reason of Mayor Jackson resigning.

An ordinance was introduced laying a specific levy of 44⁰ on each \$100. worth of taxable property in the city of Pitsville Ky. to pay off and liquidate a judgment in favor of Kelly Bros vs City of Pitsville Ky. The roll call of the members of said council and vote being taken on said ordinance the said council voted as follows:

J.M. Triplett Voting "yea".
J.D. Meade Voting "yea".
J.C. Cleveringer voting "yea".
P.F. Preston was absent and not voting. The said ordinance was declared passed.

The council adjourned to meet Nov. 17th 1917.

At a regular meeting of the Board of Council for the city of Pitsville Ky. held in the city hall on December 5th 1917. Members present, P.F. Preston, J.L. Morgan, J.C. Cleveringer & J.D. Meade.

On motion of P.F. Preston duly seconded by J.C. Cleveringer. J.L. Morgan was nominated for Mayor to fill out the unexpired term of A.J. Jackson who having resigned at a former date, said Morgan was duly elected by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Samie F.F. Ratliff and had filed his certificate of election as Councilman for the city of Pitsville Ky. and thereupon took the oath of office as required by law.

J.L. Morgan presented and had filed his certificate of election as mayor for the term beginning January 1918.

Sidney Truett presented and had filed his certificate of election for Police-Judge. Term beginning January 1918.

E.B. Coleman presented and had filed his certificate of election for Chief of Police. Term beginning January 1918.

An ordinance was passed and approved laying a levy of 44⁰ on the one hundred dollars worth of taxable property in the corporate limits of the city of Pitsville Ky. to pay off and discharge a judgment in favor of Kelly Brothers. vs City of Pitsville Ky. The vote was taken as follows: P.F. Preston "aye". J.D. Meade "aye". J.C. Cleveringer "aye". F.F. Ratliff "aye".

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of Council for the city of Pikeville Ky. held in the city hall on the 20th day of December 1917. Present J.L. Morgan, Mayor. Councilmen F.F. Ratliff.

Personally appeared H.P. Ball, Frank A. Connally, Lem Duty, J.P. Stone and Alex Elliott who having been duly elected as members of the Board of City Council at the preceding Nov. election 1917 and took the oath of office as the law requires.

On motion duly carried. It is ordered that all persons doing work for the City under and by the orders of the Chief of Police shall file with the Chief of Police and have same attached to the draft issued to them an affidavit showing the number of hours or the number of days worked and the correctness of said claim. This shall be done before being signed by the Mayor.

On Motion duly carried. It is ordered that a committee be appointed to investigate the City lock up and to ascertain what is best to be done in the matter whether to overhaul and repair the old one or to procure a suitable site for a new one and to calculate the cost of same as near as possible to do so. also to prepare a suitable place to take care of the Cities property. Such as. Scriptor, Sprinkling wagon, etc.

The Mayor in accordance to said order appointed Hill P. Ball, F.F. Ratliff and Frank Connally as members of said committee.

On motion duly carried. It is ordered that a pardon board be appointed as the law requires and the Mayor in accordance to said motion hereby appoints J.P. Stone and Lem Duty to act in conjunction with the mayor on said Board.

On motion duly carried. It is ordered that a Board of health be appointed. Thereupon in accordance to said motion. The Mayor appoints, J.P. Stone, Hill P. Ball and Frank Connally as members of said Board to take up the matter and carry out same as the law requires of such Board.

A.L. Ratliff appeared before the Board of Council and took the oath of office as city attorney according to law after having filed his certificate of election at nov. election 1917 with said Board.
