The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, May12, 2014. The meeting was held in the City Hall Conference Meeting Room located at 243 Main Street, Pikeville, Kentucky.

MINUTES

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on April 28, 2014 were in each Commission Member's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for discussion, there being none, the motion carried unanimously. 5-0.

PAYMENT OF CITY BILLS

The City Manager Donovan Blackburn requested the approval to pay city bills in the amount of \$1,060,204.04. Commissioner Davis made the motion to approve. Commissioner Coleman seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments and Commissioner Davis asked the traditional question of do we have the money. City Manager responded that we did have the money. Mayor called for further discussion, there being none, motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

1. Mayor Franklin Justice read into record a Proclamation.

City Manager Donovan Blackburn asked Carolyn Tackett to come forward. Mr. Blackburn recognized Mrs. Tackett for being awarded the Program Director of the year 2014 by the State of Kentucky. Mr. Blackburn stated that the award is a very prestige award and that was bestowed upon her as a citizen and stated it was duly earned. Mr. Blackburn added that the commission has been able to budget \$30,000.00 a year along with UMG serves to the Senior Citizens center at no cost to the facility. Mrs. Tackett said that they also take some of them to their chemotherapy treatments, we are like a home away from home.

I also spend time with them if needed in the hospital to let the family have a night at their home. The Senior Citizen center also can provide clothes if needed. The key is to keep the citizens out and busy. Commissioner Coleman stated he was extremely proud of Mrs. Tackett. Mayor called for further comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

Phillip Elswick, with Summit Engineering, Inc. was present and submitted the following request:

1. Consider a request to approve and authorize payment of pay estimate #10 submitted by Codell construction in the amount of \$411,771.42 for the Pikeville Theatre Project. The payment request was approved by the Pikeville Theatre Building Committee with the recommendation for the City Commission to authorize payment. The request included payment to: Kalkreuth Roofing & Sheet Metal in the amount of \$117,708.30, D&T Associates, Inc. in the amount of \$41,640.00, Carpet Decorators, Inc. in the amount of \$3,607.20, Abell Elevator International for \$9,134.10, Rising Sun Developing, Inc. in the amount of \$36,000.00, Ken/API Supply Company in the amount of \$10,323.12, Elliott Contracting, Inc. in the amount of \$113,000.40, Elliott Supply & Glass Company in the amount of \$37,407.36, McQuay International for \$13,290.00, and Plumbers Supply Company for \$5,255.94. The request also includes request to authorize

- the Theatre Building Committee Chairman Donovan Blackburn to sign and execute any pay request or documents necessary to execute said payments. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve. Commissioner Coleman seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 2. Consider a request to approve payment for invoice #000019 for the Pikeville Theatre Project as submitted by the Pikeville Theatre Building Committee and authorize payment as submitted to Holzman Moss Bottino in the amount of \$3,484.29. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve. Commissioner Coleman seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

ORDINANCE AMENDING
CHAPTER 72 PARKING REGULATIONS
AMENDING SECTION 72.992
FOR PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING
PARKING CITATIONS SO TO
INCRASE THE TIME TO SET A HEARING DATE
Ordinance #0-2014-008

NOW THERFORE, BE IT ORDAINED, by the City of Pikeville, that Chapter 72 section 72.992 Procedure for Contesting Citation is hereby amended as follows.

CHAPTER 72: PARKING REGULATIONS

PARKING CITATION ENFORCEMENT

§ 72.992 PROCEDURE FOR CONTESTING CITATION.

- (A) Any person cited for a parking violation as provided for herein may contest the determination that a violation occurred by requesting in writing with the City Clerk a hearing before the hearing officer, and tendering to the City Clerk the fine set forth in the notice and hearing costs in the sum of ten dollars (\$10). Such hearing shall be held no later than fourteen (14) thirty (30) days from the date of receipt by the Clerk of the requests, unless prior to the hearing the person requesting such hearing requests an extension of time not to exceed fourteen (14) thirty (30) days. No less than seven (7) days prior to the date prior to the hearing, the City Clerk shall notify the registered owner of the vehicle of the date, time and place of the hearing. Any person requesting a hearing who fails to appear at the time shall be deemed to have waived his or her right to a hearing and the determination that a violation was committed shall be considered final; further, the person shall be deemed to have refused to pay the fine levied by the citation. In that event, the fine and hearing costs submitted by the person requesting a hearing shall be retained in full by the city.
- (B) At the hearing, after consideration of the evidence, the hearing officer shall determine whether a violation was committed. Where it has not been established that the violation was committed, an order dismissing the citation may be entered. In the event of a dismissal, the fine and hearing costs tendered by the party requesting the hearing shall be

returned immediately by the city. Where it has been established that a violation was committed, the hearing officer shall uphold the citation and the fine and hearing costs submitted shall be retained in full by the city. A copy of such order shall be furnished to the owner.

- (C) The hearing officer may consider the parking citation and any other written report made under oath by the officer who issued a citation in lieu of the officer's personal appearance at the hearing.
- (D) An appeal from the hearing officer's determination may be made to the District Court of Pike County within seven (7) days of the date of the hearing officer's determination. The appeal shall be initiated by the filing of a complaint and a copy of the hearing officer's order in the same manner as any civil action under the Rules of Civil Procedure. The action shall be tried de novo and the burden shall be upon the city to establish that a violation occurred. If the Court finds that a violation did occur the city shall be permitted to keep fine and hearing costs tendered to the city and shall recover from the owner any court costs associated with the appeal. If the court finds that a violation did not occur, the city shall be ordered to dismiss the citation, return the fine and hearing costs tendered by the owner along with his or her taxable costs of the appeal.
- (E) The judgment of the District Court may be appealed to the Circuit Court in accordance with the Rules of Civil Procedure.
- (F) The city shall be authorized to employ on a part-time or full-time basis an individual to serve as a hearing officer pursuant to this subchapter at such compensation as the Board of Commissioners feels reasonable.

3. Consider a 1st reading of ordinance #0-2014-009 adopting the 2014 Supplement to the City Code of Ordinances.

CITY MANAGER

City Manager Donovan Blackburn presented the commission with the following items for approval:

- 1. Consider a request to authorize and approve a conditional job offer to Ashley Arnold and Jonathan Harris for the position of City Dispatcher, at the starting rate for said position, contingent upon their completing and passing of all required pre-employment testing for said position. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve. Commissioner Carter seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 2. Consider a request to authorize and approve the hiring of Ronnie D. Hylton for the position of Executive Director of Events at the starting rate for said position contingent upon the completion and passing all required pre-employment tests. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve. Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments. Mr. Blackburn asked Mr. Hylton to come forward and introduce himself to the commission. Mr. Hylton gave an overview of

his background, college and working experience. Mr. Hylton stated he was from Elkhorn and lived there until he was around 10 years of age then he moved to Pikeville with his mother. Mr. Hylton stated he moved to West VA when he was 17 due to his dad's job changed. He joined the ARMY 2004-2008. Mr. Hylton stated he did a yearlong deployment in 2006 to September 2007 in Iraq. Mr. Hylton stated he then went directly to the Kentucky National Guard and he used GI Bill to put himself through college at Pikeville University with the exception of one semester where he transferred to EKU and then came back to complete at Pikeville. Mayor Justice stated he was impressed and welcomed him to the City. Mayor called for additional comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

- 3. Consider a request to authorize and approve an Engineering Service Proposal by Summit Engineering for the creation of a bicycle Route Master Plan for the City and authorize the mayor to sign and execute said proposal on behalf of the City of Pikeville. Commissioner Carter made the motion to approve. Commissioner Coleman seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 4. Consider a request to call a special work session for May 23, 2014 at 2:00 p.m. for the purpose of conducting the 2014-2015 City Operations Budget Work session. Commissioner Carter made the motion to approve. Commissioner Coleman seconded the motion. Mayor called for comments. City Manager commented the regular meeting was canceled on Monday, May 26, 2014 due to Memorial Day and a holiday for the city. Mayor Justice called for additional comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 5. Consider a request to amend a motion adopted on during the April 28, 2014 City Commission meeting as follows: Consider a request to authorize and approve the purchase of a track of property located on South Mayo Trail owned by Joan Johnson, as submitted, through Abode Realty for the purchase price of \$225,000.00 (which is the fair market value, as submitted). To also consider the request to authorize payment for said track of property along with any other cost associated with, to include but not limited to, the transfer, taxes and realty fees for said property. To also authorize the mayor authority to sign and execute the deed of conveyance or any other paperwork available for said conveyance and or closing. The request also includes to authorize the City Manager, Donovan Blackburn or City Attorney Russell Davis to sign any additional paperwork necessary for closing on behalf of the City of Pikeville for the purchase of the property. Commissioner Carter made the motion to approve. Commissioner Coleman seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.
- 6. Consider a request to award a bid and authorize the purchase and authorize payment, as recommended by the city's hired engineer firm of

Vaughn and Melton Consulting Engineers, Inc. who have reviewed the bid package information for the purchase of two (2) mechanical screens and a (one unit) sludge belt filter press. The submitted information and pricing from Parkson Corporation would be in the amount of \$289,633.00 and from Komline Sanderson Engineering Corp. would be in the amount of \$274,710.00. It would appear the bid submittals meet the intent/scope of the project. The corresponding unit prices appear to be within range of the Engineer's pre-bid estimate, and project budget. In addition, we have found the two base bid items to be acceptable in terms of our engineering Commissioner Chaney made the motion to Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments, there being none motion passed unanimously. 5-0.

- 7. Pursuant to KRS 61.810, consider a request for closed session for the purpose of discussion economic development, legal and personnel issues. Commissioner Carter made to motion. Commissioner Davis seconded the motion. Mayor Justice called for comments, there being none, motion passed. 5-0.
