# CITY OF PIKEVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING MINUTES August 12, 2019 AT 6:00 P.M.

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, August 12, 2019. The meeting was held in the City Hall Meeting Room located at 243 Main Street, Pikeville, Kentucky 41501.

#### MINUTES

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on July 22, 2019 were in each Commission Member's agenda package. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner Pat McNamee made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Bob Shurtleff seconded the motion. Mayor Jimmy Carter called for comments, there being none, the motion carried unanimously. 5-0.

## PAYMENT OF CITY BILLS

The City Manager Philip Elswick requested the approval to pay city bills in the amount of \$2,219,531.52. Commissioner Steve Hartsock made the motion to approve.
