The street committee reported, no definite measures taken, they were given till next meeting to further investigate matters and report.

D. T. Keel, be <sup>2d</sup> he is allowed the sum of \$20.83 for service as mayor from June 1, 1914, up to June 1, 1914.

on motion, duly seconded, the ordinance passed in Mansury June 1, 1914, taxing bicycles, and licensing and bonding motor cycles, automobiles and <sup>motor</sup> vehicles, was repealed, before being posted.

On motion of G. W. Hackney duly seconded, by Lauck Williams the license tax on Theaters was reduced from \$100.00 to \$50.00 <sup>per year</sup> and license tax on circuses reduced from \$100.00 to \$50.00 <sup>per day</sup>. A roll call of the votes stood as follows:  
Lauck Williams "yea" Geo. W. Hackney "yea" Linton Trust "yea" W. E. Gost "yea" T. M. Peery, <sup>not</sup> voting, ~~may~~ O. B. Stratton absent, motion was carried to reduce the license.

On motion duly made and seconded an ordinance was adopted by the City Council providing for license and bond of motorcycles automobiles and <sup>for private use</sup> motor vehicles. The vote stands as follows, Linton Trust, "yea" T. M. Peery, "yea" W. E. Gost "yea" Lauck Williams, "yea" G. W. Hackney, "yea" said ordinance was unanimously adopted.

On motion of T. M. Peery, duly seconded, an ordinance was agreed on to be adopted next meeting, on weights and measures. The City Atty. was directed to draw said ordinance.
