At a regular adjourned meeting of the City Council held in the City Hall of Pikeville Ky. on Feb. 15<sup>th</sup> 1915 I.M. Williams Mayor and the following Councilmen present. J.B. Parker, J.R. Johnson, Lark Williams and Linton Trivett.

H.S. Dammann, City Clerk, commissioned to sell electric Franchise filed his report of sale herein on Feb 15<sup>th</sup> 1915. which is in words and figures as follows:

To the Hon. Mayor and City Council of Pikeville Ky. the undersigned H.S. Dammann, City Clerk, duly appointed and commissioned by the City Council, to make sale of a franchise for lighting the streets of Pikeville, with electricity and furnishing the same to the inhabitants thereof, in an ordinance adopted on the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of Feb. 1915, would respectfully report that he did on the 12<sup>th</sup> day of Feb. 1915, at the front door of the Court House in the City of Pikeville Ky. between the hours of 10 A.M. and 2 P.M. after having advertised the terms and place of sale by pasting notices in 3 public places in said city at least 10 days just prior to day of sale expose for sale at public auction and out-cry to the highest and best bidder, the rights, privileges and franchise contained in said ordinance. Ordering the sale thereof subject to the conditions and limitations contained therein.

Therefore the said rights, privileges and Franchise was knocked off, and sold to L.L. Stone for the Sandy Valley Light and Power Co. for the sum of \$25<sup>00</sup> He being the highest and best bidder. Therefore the said sum was paid to me and was turned over to G.B. Thornsbury, City Treasurer, and his receipt for same is filed herewith and made part of this report, all of which is respectfully reported.

The ordinance entitled an ordinance for lighting the streets and alleys of the City of Pikeville Ky. with electricity and furnishing same to the inhabitants thereof was passed and the rights, privileges, authority and franchise for lighting the streets and alleys of the city of Pikeville with electricity and furnishing same to the inhabitants thereof, was granted to L.L. Stone, for The Sandy Valley Light and Power Co. successors or assigns for the period of 20 years.

Ordered That

H.S. Dammann, as Commissioner he and he is allowed the sum of \$14<sup>20</sup> for services rendered in selling <sup>electric</sup> franchise.
