At a regular adjourned meeting of the city council convened and held in the city hall in the city of Pikeville Ky. on May 10th 1915. Hon. J.M. Williams Mayor and the following councilmen present. T.G. Parker, J.H. Johnson, Linton Trivett, Lank Williams & W.C. Gant.

On motion duly made and carried, the following board of supervisors was appointed. P.F. Truster, M.G. Bowles & Dick Thompson, same being property owners as the law requires, to supervise the tax books for year 1915.

An ordinance fitting the tax levy for year 1915 was presented and adopted by a unanimous vote of the Council for the rate of taxation, at 75^{cts} on each one hundred dollars worth of taxable property inside the corporate limits of the city of Pikeville also, \$1.50 poll tax on each and every male citizen over 21 years of age living inside the corporation.

By unanimous vote of the Council an ordinance is adopted known as motor cycle ordinance, requiring a bond of \$10.00 and bond of \$200.00 before any one is allowed to operate a motor machine for private use in the city of Pikeville.
