At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville Ky, convened and held in the City hall on Dec. 14th 1915.

Hon. A.J. Jackson Mayor and the following Councilmen present. J.M. Triplett, P.F. Preston, J.M. Coleman, J.D. Meade, Virgil Forsythe and J.L. Morgan.

L. Dye, Chief of Police tendered his written resignation as such to take effect at once, said resignation was accepted, and said Dye was released from further duties.

By reason of the resignation of L. Dye as Chief of Police it became necessary to fill the vacancy so made. The name Sidney Trivitt was put in nomination and by unanimous vote of the Council, said Trivitt was elected to fill out the unexpired term of L. Dye as Chief of Police.

On motion of J.L. Morgan, Councilman, duly seconded, Sidney Trivitt is hereby appointed to collect the remainder of uncollected taxes due the City for years 1914, and 15, and said Trivitt is required to give bond for said collection to be approved by the Mayor.

On motion duly made and carried, A.J. Jackson Mayor, together with P.F. Preston & J.L. Morgan, Councilmen is hereby appointed as members of the pardon or remitting board for the City of Pikeville, Ky.

The Street Committee together with the Mayor, is hereby directed to investigate the situation at foot of Kentucky Avenue, concerning making an underground crossing at said point and also look after some drainage in said Avenue and report at next meeting.

On motion duly made and carried it is ordered that the reports of the Auditing Committee be received as read, and said committee discharged.

The City Clerk is hereby directed to have the report of the Auditing Committee published in the Pike County news, if same can be done at a reasonable price.

L. Dye be and he is allowed the sum of \$1.28 balance due him for collecting taxes for the City.

Ordered that,

Pikeville Gro. Co. be and it is allowed the sum of \$8.80 for roofing furnished the City for lock-up.

Ordered that,

R.C. Huffman be and he is allowed the sum of \$1.25 for work on lock-up.

Ordered that,

Ponto Cochran be and he is allowed the sum of \$1.93 for work on lock-up.

Ballard Morris be and he is allowed the sum of \$1.25 for work done on lock-up.

The names of R.C. Huffman, G.C. Maynard, Arthur Smith, J.H. Heathly and Butler Sales, as applicants for the office of Police for the City of Pikeville Ky, was presented to Board of Council, and on motion of Virgil Forsythe, duly carried, the Council was to consider the matter among themselves, and after some deliberation said Council decided to elect by ticket vote, which was done, resulting in five votes for G.C. Maynard one vote for Arthur Smith. Thereupon G.C. Maynard was declared elected as Police.

Came Sidney Trivett after being elected by the council to
fill out the unexpired term of L. Dye, as Chief of Police
and took the oath of office as required by law, and
entered into bond as such, which is in words
