The report of settlement made with Police Judge for month of Dec. 1915. was accepted & approved and ordered recorded in the proper book.

The City Clerk was directed to make a contract with J.S. Cline, as to rent of the 2. story building just below said Cline's office on Grace avenue, for City Hall and Police headquarters.

Geo. Penson Jr who was duly elected City atty at the nov. election 1915. presented himself and took the oath of office as required by law. said oath was administered to said Penson by H.S. Damon, Notary Public on Dec. 29th 1915.

J.H. Hatcher, who was duly elected City assessor at the nov. election 1915. presented himself and took the oath of office as required by.

Came Sidney Trivett who was duly elected Chief of Police at nov. election 1915. and executed bond to the City of Pikeville in the sum of Twenty five hundred (\$2500⁰⁰) Dollars with the United States Fidelity and Guaranty Co. of Baltimore Md. as his surety, which bond was accepted by the Council and approved by the Mayor, and attested by the Clerk.

Thereupon the said Sidney Trivett presented himself and took the oath of office as required by law.
