

At a meeting of the City Council of the City of Pikeville Ky. held in the City hall on the 13th day of Nov. 1917. in pursuance of an order of the Pike Circuit Court. on Sept 28th 1917. Requiring the said Council to meet and lay a levy sufficient to pay off and liquidate a judgment in favor of Kelly Bros vs. City of Pikeville Ky.

The following members of the Council was present to wit: J.L. Morgan, J.M. Triplett, I.C. Clevinger, J.D. Meade and J.M. Coleman. J.L. Morgan, was elected Mayor Protem of said meeting the office of Mayor being vacant. by reason of Mayor Jackson resigning.

An Ordinance was introduced laying a specific levy of 44¢ on each \$100. worth of taxable property in the City of Pikeville, Ky. to pay off and liquidate a judgment in favor of Kelly Bros vs. City of Pikeville Ky. The roll call of the members of said Council and vote being taken on said ordinance the said Council voted as follows:

J.M. Triplett. Voting "yes" J.M. Coleman Voting "yes". J.D. Meade. Voting "yes" I.C. Clevinger. Voting "yes" C.F. Ouston was absent and not voting. The said Ordinance was declared passed.

The Council adjourned to meet. Nov. 17th 1917.

Mayor Protem

At a regular meeting of the Board of Council for the City of Pikeville Ky. held in the City hall on December 3rd 1917. Members present, C.F. Ouston, J.L. Morgan, I.C. Clevinger & J.D. Meade.

On motion of C.F. Ouston duly seconded by I.C. Clevinger. J.L. Morgan was nominated for Mayor to fill out the unexpired term of A.D. Jackson who having resigned at a former date, said Morgan was duly elected by a unanimous vote of the Council.

Carrie F.F. Ratliff and had filed his certificate of election as Councilman for the City of Pikeville Ky. and thereupon took the oath of office as required by law.

J.L. Morgan, presented and had filed his certificate of election as Mayor for the term beginning January 1918.

Sidney Trivett presented and had filed his certificate of election, for Police-Judge. Term beginning January, 1918.

E.B. Coleman presented and had filed his certificate of election for Chief of Police. Term beginning January, 1918.

An ordinance was passed and approved laying a levy of 44 cents on the one hundred dollars worth of taxable property in the corporate limits of the City of Pikeville Ky. to pay off and discharge a judgment in favor of Kelly Brothers vs. City of Pikeville Ky. The vote was taken as follows: C.F. Ouston "aye" J.D. Meade "aye" I.C. Clevinger "aye" F.F. Ratliff "aye"

W. Starkey be and he is allowed the sum of \$6⁰⁰ for phone service from Oct. 19-1917. upto Jan. 19th 1918.

Ordered That
U. N. Williams & son be and they are allowed the sum of \$51⁴⁰ for account filed to date.

Ordered That
Lida E. Keller be and she is allowed the sum of \$25⁰⁰ for rent of stray pen. from Oct. 16th 1916. upto Oct. 16th 1917. as per contract.
