Ordered that A. L. Rathoff be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$25⁰⁰ for salary as city attorney for month of February, 1918.

Ordered that E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$16⁰⁰ for flushing water pipes, taking care of water hose, &c., for months of January and February, 1918, as chief of police.

Ordered that E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$30⁰⁰, three percent commission for collecting \$1000⁰⁰, special levy in case of Kelly Bros., in City of Pikeville.

Ordered that E. M. Thornburn be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$70⁰⁰ for salary as Deputy policeman for month of February, 1918.

At a regular meeting of the Board of City Council for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall on the 1st day of April, 1918; the following councilmen being present: J. J. Stone, Alex Elliott, Lem Duty, Frank A. Connelly and F. F. Rathoff.

Mayor, J. L. Morgan, being absent, Councilman, Frank A. Connelly was elected mayor pro tem by unanimous vote.

Councilman Alex Elliott introduced an ordinance providing for the construction and maintenance of a sewerage system with sufficient catch basins at the mouth of Francis Hollow at the junction of Kentucky and Auxier avenues and across the street, including the right of way of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky; also sufficient sewerage system with catch basins to drain the properties at the Riddle Hollow in like manner in said city. Said Elliott moved that said ordinance be passed, which was seconded by F. F. Rathoff. Upon roll call the members of the Council present voted as follows: Alex Elliott, "yea"; J. J. Stone, "yea"; F. F. Rathoff, "yea"; Lem Duty, "no". As a majority of the Council present voted "yea", said ordinance was declared passed.
