

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, ^{held} on the 5th day of August, 1918, in the city hall, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, Alex Elliott, F. F. Ratliff, W. P. Call, J. C. Clevinger, R. Thompson and A. F. Childers.

The matter wherein E. B. Coleman, Chief of Police, was directed to show cause why he should not be dismissed passed over until the regular meeting in September.

W. P. Call moved that the city council call an election for the purpose of raising \$20,000⁰⁰ (twenty thousand dollars) for the purpose of constructing a sewer line in the city parallel with the line already laid or otherwise as the Council may hereafter direct for the purpose of making adequate drainage for all sewage and surface water as may accumulate in said town or corporation pursuant to motion made and carried July 13th, 1918. A. F. Childers seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: W. P. Call, yes; A. F. Childers, yes; J. C. Clevinger, no; Alex Elliott, no; Richard Thompson, yes; and F. F. Ratliff, yes. As a majority voted for said motion the mayor declared same carried.

Claim of Call Brothers Hardware Company for \$152.26 for goods purchased by city from October 3rd, 1916 to May 14, 1918, is allowed, and it is ordered that \$12.60 be deducted from claim of E. B. Coleman, Chief of Police, said amount being charged to him personally by the city.

Mr. W. J. S. Hand, of the Sandy Valley Light & Power Company, made a statement to the Council regarding the light and franchise matter. A. F. Childers, representing the committee appointed to investigate said matter, reported that the committee had nothing to report.

W. P. Call moved that the mayor appoint a new committee to investigate said light matter and report any time the mayor may set. Said motion lost for want of a second.

W. P. Call moved that the mayor appoint A. F. Childers and A. J. Ratliff to investigate the tax matter with the assessor and ascertain the reason why said assessor has not gotten his tax books ready for the Board of Supervisors and report to the Council next Saturday at eight o'clock, P. M.

Mayor, J. L. Morgan, tendered his resignation in writing as mayor of said city, which was rejected by the Council.

The mayor appointed A. J. Ratliff in lieu of Hi Pauley as a member of the Board of Supervisors.

ordered that

A. J. Ratliff be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$75⁰⁰ for salary as city attorney for month of July, 1918.

ordered that

Call Brothers Hardware Company be and it is hereby allowed the sum of \$264.41 for tiling ordered for said city and furnished to it by said company.

upon motion made, duly recorded and carried, Council is adjourned until August 10th, 1918.

at a regular adjourned meeting of the Board of City Council of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall on the 10th day of August, 1918, the following were present: J. L. Morgan, Mayor, and Councilmen, F. F. Ratliff, W. P. Call, J. C. Clevinger, Richard Thompson and Alex Elliott.

W. P. Call moved that Dr. D. D. Bodenkimi be required to construct sewerage sufficient to drain his hog pen back of Scott's Livery Stable on Second Street. Richard Thompson seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

Richard Thompson moved that the light rates of the Sandy Valley Light and Power Company stand as they now are. Said motion lost for want of a second.

J. C. Clevinger moved that the Council sell a new light franchise embracing twenty-four ^{hours} service per day. F. F. Ratliff seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, yes;
