

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 18th day of March 1930, the following were present: Mayor, F.A. Connolly, Councilmen, G.H. Francisco, Rush Sword and Elmon Walters:

Judge Hi Pauley appeared before the City Council and asked that some relief be given the County, with reference to the water being used by the jail and toilets under same which is used by the public.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the matter of water adjustment asked for Hi Pauley, for the County Jail is referred to the Public Utilities Committee and the Mayor and Supt., of water Department for investigation and a report of their findings and recommendations at the next meeting of this Board.

Councilman, Stafford Sowards now present and acting.

The Committee appointed with reference to securing lease on Fire Station makes report and presents contract as being the best terms obtainable and recommends that same be entered into by the city.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the contract for Fire Station is accepted and ordered signed on behalf of the city by the Mayor, after a clause has been added with reference to any additions made to said building by the city, if any should be.

Councilman T.N. Huffman Jr., now present and acting.

The Committee appointed to designate lights (Street Lights) to be discontinued makes its report, which is as follows, to-wit: "Your Committee begs to report as follows: We have made an investigation of all the street lights now in the city and wish to report that the following designated lights should be discontinued for the best interest of the city: (1) Second Street light above crossing on Cline Street; (2) Second Street light above J.A. McCowan's store on Cline Street; (3) Street Light between Second and Main Streets on Pike Avenue; (4) Street light in front of Presbyterian Church; (5) Street light on Coal Bridge of Pike Ice Company; (6) Street Light at intersection of Jefferston Street and Alley; (7) Street Light, third light on Brick Street; (8) Street Light in rear of Foster Thornburg Hardware Building; (9) Street Light in alley near Public School Building; (10) Street Light near Christian Church on Scott Avenue; (11) Street Light near middle of High Street, at fire plug." all of which is respectfully reported.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the report of the Committee to designate street lights to be discontinued, is approved, accepted and made the orders of this Council, and the city clerk is directed to give a certified copy of this order to the Kentucky & West Virginia Power Company directing that said Street Lights designated in said report be discontinued on and after April 1st, 1930.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, council is adjourned until the next regular meeting date.
