

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city, on the 20th day of January 1931, the following were present: Mayor, F.A. Connolly, Councilmen, G.H. Francisco, Rush Sword, and Stafford Sowards.

The minutes not heretofore read are now read by the clerk and on motion duly made, seconded and carried, are approved.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, a permit is granted to J.S. Cline, to construct two (2) brick buildings, one fronting the public square opposite the Court house and back of the First National Bank Building, and one on Erace Avenue. Said buildings to be constructed according to and in conformance with the building regulations now in effect in the City of Pikeville, Kentucky.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, a permit is granted, to J.S. Cline, the First National Bank and Pike County, jointly or severally, to construct storm and sanitary sewer, leading from their properties into Division Street and following out along Division Street to the Big Sandy River. Said parties so constructing the sewer herein mentioned to build necessary spillways to care for the outlet of said sewer where it empties into the river. Said sewer, when so constructed is to become and remain a part of the city sewer system.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, a permit is granted to H.M. Kash and R.T. Greer, to construct a two-car garage on Auxier Avenue. Same to be constructed in accordance with the building regulations now in effect in said City.

Councilman, Elmon Walters and T.N. Huffman Jr., now present and acting.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, it is ordered that A.W. White be exonerated from paying city taxes for the year 1929, on a valuation of \$3320.00, same being listed as cash in bank and bonds, which are not taxable for city purposes. It further appearing that said sum had been paid, it is ordered and directed that the City Clerk issue to A.W. White a City Voucher on the General Expenditure Budget Fund in the sum of \$24.90, as a refund of said tax paid, which was collected through error on erroneous assessment.

Councilman, D.C. Moore, now present and acting.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the Public Utilities Committee is directed to investigate the placing of lights on North Hellier Street and High Street, and they will report their findings at the next meeting of the Board.

The City Clerk made oral report on the refund of taxes requested by C.M. Keyser Sr., for the year 1926, which report is approved.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, the General Service Garage is granted a permit to construct a power line across Huffman Avenue and up and along the alley between the C.&O. Railroad and College Street, to the Pikeville Ice Company's plant. The construction of said line to not in any way affect or come in contact with any other power line now constructed over or along said street or alley.

ORDERED THAT:

Rush Sword be allowed the sum of Three (\$3.00) Dollars, for expenses paid in painting signs and markers, as per bill of 1-17-1931, payable out of General Expenditure Budget Fund.

On motion duly made, seconded and carried, Council is adjourned until 7:30 o'clock Thursday, January 22, 1931.
