

MINUTES } CITY OF PIKEVILLE

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, convened and held at the city hall in said city on the 25th day of May 1931, the following were present: Mayor, F.A. Connolly, Councilmen, G.H. Francisco, D.C. Moore, Rush Sword and Elmon Walters.

It appearing that Richard Thompson, Jno. A. Bentley and T.J. Williamson, has failed to qualify of accept the appointment on the City Board of Equilization for the year 1931, therefore,

Councilman, G.H. Francisco, nominted A.J. Akers, Francis Rice and T.T. Rogers as members of the City Board of Equilization for the Year 1931, and there being no further nominations, upon a roll call the vote was as follows:

The result of said vote being announced, the Mayor thereupon declared, the said A.J. Akers, Francis Rice and T.T. Rogers, duly elected as members of the City Board of Equilization for the year 1931.

A.J. Akers, Francis Rice and T.T. Rogers, being present in open council, accepted said appointment as a member of the Board of Equilization for the year 1931, and took the oath of office as required by law.

Upon motion of R.P. Robinson, Chief of Police City of Pikeville, Kentucky, and consented to and confirmed by F.A. Connolly, Mayor, it is ordered that Lexton Justice be and he is hereby appointed Special Policeman for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, for a period of one week, beginning May 24th, 1931, to May 31, 1931,

F.A. Connolly, Mayor.


