CITY OF PIKEVILLE BOARD OF COMMISSIONERS REGULAR MEETING MINUTES March 9, 2009 AT 6:00 P.M.

The Board of Commissioners for the City of Pikeville met in a regular called session on Monday, March 9, 2009. The meeting was held in the City Hall Conference Meeting Room located at 118 College Street, Pikeville, Kentucky.

There being a quorum present, Mayor Franklin D. Justice called the meeting to order at: 6:00 p.m. Commission Members present at roll call were a follows:

MINUTES

The minutes for the previous regular meeting held on February 23, 2009 were in each Commission Member's agenda package along with the following minutes: 5/13/02, 7/8/02, 1/27/03, 3/10/03, 5/28/03, 6/9/03, 6/19/03, 7/14/03, 7/18/03, 9/8/03, 9/22/03, 11/10/03, 12/22/03, 1/26/04, 2/23/04, 4/19/04, 6/14/04, 7/26/04, 8/23/04,9/13/04 and 9/27/04. The commission was asked to approve the present and past minutes and to authorize the mayor to sign each copy to execute. There being no additions or corrections, Commissioner Chaney made the motion to approve the minutes as prepared. Commissioner Layne seconded the motion. Mayor Frank Justice called for discussion, there being none the motion carried unanimously.

PAYMENT OF CITY BILLS

A list of City Bills totaling \$\frac{\\$465,928.47}\$ was presented to the Commission for approval of payment. Commissioner Layne made the motion to approve. Commissioner Chaney seconded the motion. Mayor Frank Justice called for discussion; City Manager Donovan Blackburn added a pay request for Bob Amos Baseball Field and RV Park in the amount of: \$63,013.50 and a pay request for H2O Construction, Inc. for Bill Lykins Creek Water Line in the amount of \$116,298.00. Commissioner Layne amended his motion to approve the two additional invoices as explained by the City Manager. Commissioner Chaney seconded the amended motion. Mayor Justice called for other comments or discussion and there being none the motion carried unanimously.

BUSINESS FROM THE FLOOR

Mayor Justice called for any business from the floor. There being none other than the Lykins Annexation the mayor asked for the City Attorney Item No. 1 to be read.

City Attorney Rusty Davis submitted the reading and request of the 2nd reading and adoption of an ordinance 0 2009 006 declaring the intention to annex certain unincorporated territory comprising of approximately 350.21 acres onto Lykins Branch. Mayor Justice called motion. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to adopt. Commissioner Layne seconded the motion. Gentleman from the floor submitted a petition to the Commission that the residents did not want to be a part of the City of Pikeville. The Mayor called for roll call: Dallas Layne; Yes, Gene Davis: Reluctantly; Yes, Jimmy Carter; Yes, Barry Chaney; Yes, Frank Justice; Yes. Ordinance passed unanimously.

ORDINANCE DECLARING THE INTENTION OF THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE TO ANNEX CERTAIN UNINCORPORATED TERRITORY LYING ADJACENT TO THE PRESENT CITY CORPORATE LIMITS AND COMPRISING OF APPROXIMATELY 350.21 ACRES EXTENDING THE CITY'S CORPORATE LIMITS ONTO LYKINS BRANCH

ORDINANCE NO. 0-2009-006

WHEREAS, the City of Pikeville pursuant to KRS 81A.420 declares that it is the desirable to annex certain unincorporated territory being more particularly described hereafter,

WHEREAS, the territory to be annexed is adjacent and contiguous to the City of Pikeville's existing boundaries and

WHEREAS, the Pikeville City Commission has determined that by reason of the population density, commercial and/or industrial use of the surrounding land, the territory sought to be annexed by the City of Pikeville is urban in character and suitable for development for the urban purposes by the City of Pikeville without unreasonable delay;

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED BY THE CITY OF PIKEVILLE that the City of Pikeville does hereby declare that it is desirable to annex certain unincorporated property described hereinafter and does herby declare it the intention of

the City of Pikeville pursuant to 81A.420 to annex the property described hereinafter.

The unincorporated territory to be annexed is described as follows:

BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that following the publication of this ordinance as required by law, that if within sixty (60) days hereof, 50% of the residents voters or owners of real property within the limits of the above-described territory do not petition the Mayor at City Hall, 118 College Street, Pikeville, Kentucky 41501 in opposition to the proposal, that a final ordinance will be passed finally annexing the above-described territory. If within sixty (60) days hereof, 50% of the resident voters or owner's of real property within the limits of the territory proposed to be annexed, petition the Mayor in opposition to the proposal, an election shall be held at the next regular election occurring

at least sixty (60) days after a certified copy of the petition is presented to the County Court Clerk by the Mayor.

This ordinance shall be in full force and effect after it is passed and published as required by law.

The above ordinance was given a first reading this 9th day of February, 2009. This ordinance was given a second reading on the 9th day of March, 2009.

Passed this 9th day of March 2009.

NOTICE OF RIGHT TO PETITION

Per KRS 81A.420, this publication shall serve to put on notice all resident voters and real property owners within the territory proposed to be annexed by the City of Pikeville's Ordinance O-2008-009, of their right to petition the mayor of the City of

Pikeville to place the questions of annexation on the ballot for a vote. A valid petition may be presented to the City of Pikeville's mayor at Pikeville City Hall within 60 days from the enactment of Ordinance O-2008-009. A valid petition must be signed by either 50% of the resident voters within the territory described above proposed to be annexed or 50% of the real property owners within the territory described above proposed to be annexed.

B. CITY ENGINEERS REPORT:

1. City Engineer Jack Sykes submitted an update and overview of current projects that Summit Engineering Inc. was working on in the City. Thompson Road up to date and right of way pending. KY 1426 Rock fall should be ready to have a conference with City Manager around June. Bill Lykins Water Line Project nearing completion. Bob Amos RV Park will be ready by April. Mayor Justice questioned Mr. Sykes on if there would be blacktop on the site. Mr. Sykes; Yes, if blacktop plants are open.

C. CITY ATTORNEY REPORT

- 1. Rusty Davis presented a request of a 1st reading of ordinance 0 2009 007 amending Chapter 32 "Departments, Boards and Commissions" deleting various non existing boards. No further action was required. The 2nd reading is scheduled for March 23rd 2009.
- 2. Rusty Davis presents a request of a 1st reading of ordinance 0 2009 008 deleting the Chapter 94 in reference to: Public Library. Mayor Justice called for comments. City Manager Donovan Blackburn noted that these were clean up items. He had passed the ordinance and when submitted to legal the strike thru was left out and changes not noted. No further action was required. The 2nd reading is scheduled for March 23rd 2009.
- D. CITY MANAGERS REPORT: City Manager Donovan Blackburn asked the commission to consider the following requests.
 - 1. Consider request to a request to award bid for garbage truck to the low bidder Mid State Equipment Company in the amount of \$114,081.17 and to authorize the city manager to sign all necessary paperwork to purchase and transfer the garbage truck into the city of Pikeville name. Commissioner Davis made the motion to approve. Commissioner Chaney seconded the motion. Mayor

- Justice called for further discussion. Commissioner Layne questioned why the City did not purchase locally with the company Worldwide Equipment. City Manager replied that UMG preferred the unit selected over Ken worth based on service and the warranty was a life time vs a few years as stated. The City Manager reminded the commission was best price along with best value. He stated UMG supported and recommend and the City Manager agreed with the recommendation from Mid State Equiptment Company based on value, brand, warranty and bid specs. Mayor Justice called for further discussion, there being none the motion passed unanimously.
- 2. Consider request to award the bid to Elkhorn Ambulance Service, Inc. for them to purchase two surplus ambulances in the amount of \$10,000.00 each from the City of Pikeville and to authorize the City Manager to sign and execute all documents required to transfer the ambulances to Elkhorn Ambulance Service. Commissioner Davis made the motion to approve. Commissioner Chaney seconded the motion. Mayor Frank Justice called for discussion, there being none the Mayor called for the vote to approve as submitted and the motion carried unanimously.
- 3. Consider request to adopt a resolution for the intent to make an application to the KY Transportation Cabinet for assistance under the 2009 Transportation Enhancement Program in the amount of \$410,000.00 and the TEA-21 program will require a 20% match for the project. Mayor Justice read the Resolution into record. Commissioner Chaney made the motion to adopt. Commissioner Layne seconded the motion to adopt. Mayor Justice called for discussion, there being no further discussion the motion to adopt carried unanimously.
