AT a regular meeting of the Board of City Council for the City of Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall on the 1st day of April, 1918; The following councilmen being present: J. J. Stone, Alex Elliott, Lem Duty, Frank A. Connally and F. F. Ratliff.

Mayor, J. L. Morgan, being absent, councilman, Frank A. Connally was elected mayor pro tem by unanimous vote.

Councilman Alex Elliott introduced an ordinance providing for the construction and maintenance of a sewerage system with sufficient catch basins at the mouth of Francis Hollow at the junction of Kentucky and Auxier avenues and across the street, including the right of way of the Chesapeake and Ohio Railway Company in the city of Pikeville, Kentucky; also sufficient sewerage system with catch basins to drain the properties at the Riddle Hollow in like manner in said city. Said Elliott moved that said ordinance be passed, which was seconded by F. F. Ratliff. Upon roll call the members of the council present voted as follows: Alex Elliott, "yea"; J. J. Stone, "yea"; F. F. Ratliff, "yea"; Lem Duty, "no"; as a majority of the council present voted "yea", said ordinance was declared passed.

The city clerk's settlements with the chief of Police for the months of January, February and March, 1918, were received, filed and approved.

It is ordered that the city clerk when collecting payments, in whole or in part, on street paving collect interest on same to the first of October following, and all orders in conflict with this one are annulled.

Citizen J. G. Parker appeared before the city council and stated that he had been over-taxed \$1100⁰⁰ on city tax for year 1917 and special levy in case of Kelly Brothers vs City of Pikeville, being \$825 on city tax and \$440 on special levy. Upon motion made, duly seconded, and unanimously carried, the city attorney is ordered to go with Mr. Parker before the Board and investigate said matter and report his acts at the next regular meeting.

F. A. Connally, mayor pro tem, introduced an ordinance entitled an ordinance allowing the police judge a certain sum of money for clerk hire to be used as he sees necessary, which sum was \$25⁰⁰ per month. Upon roll call the members of the council present voted as follows: J. J. Stone, "yea"; Alex Elliott, "yea"; F. F. Ratliff, "yea" and Lem Duty "yea". Said ordinance was declared passed, no one present voting against same.

The city clerk is directed to order assessment blanks for the city assessor for the year, 1918.

The city clerk is directed to order a broom for the street cleaning department.

It is ordered that J. W. Call be and he is hereby appointed by the city council as committeman to purchase 1000 feet of tiling 36 inches in diameter for the purpose of constructing sewerage from opposite the mouth of Francis Hollow to the river; also to order 150 feet of ten inch tiling for the purpose of drainage of other parts of town.

Councilman J. J. Stone tendered his resignation, but same was not taken up or acted on at said meeting.

On motion made, duly seconded, and unanimously carried Council is adjourned until April 5, 1918.

Upon roll call all members present voted for said Cleverger for the office of city councilman, W. P. Call being absent. The Mayor declared J. C. Cleverger duly elected as a member of the city council.
