At a regular meeting of the Board of City Council of
Pikeville, Kentucky, held in the city hall on the 3rd day
of June, 1918, the following were present: Hon. J. L. Morgan,
Mayor, and councilmen, Alex Elliott, F. F. Ratliff, J. C.
Clevinger and F. A. Connally.

The Reading of the minutes of the last meeting were read
and approved.

F. F. Ratliff made the following motion: "Resolved that
the officials of the C. & O. Ry. Co. be requested to keep
open and pave the present opening under the railroad
at the point on Main Street and Kentucky Avenue where
same is opened at present for the purpose of providing
an underground passage way for persons travelling said
streets. That the railroad Company be advised that same
is to the interest of both the city and the railway Company
and will tend to prevent accidents. H. M. Nostkins, J. L.
Francis and the city attorney, A. J. Ratliff, are appointed
to take this matter up with the railroad company."

The resignation of Councilman, Lem A. Duty, was tendered
and read to the Council upon motion made by J. A.
Connally, seconded by F. F. Ratliff, and unanimously
carried said resignation was accepted.

J. C. Clevinger placed in nomination for city Council
man, A. J. Childers. There were no other nominations.
Upon roll call all members present voted for said
Childers, W. P. Call being absent. The mayor declared
A. J. Childers duly elected as a member of the city
Council of Pikeville, Kentucky.

A. J. Childers appeared and accepted the office of coun-
cilmnan of the city of Pikeville and took the oath of
office as required by law, which was administered
by the city clerk.

Messrs. W. T. S. Rand, L. L. Stone and J. P. Johnson Jr.,
representing the Sunny Valley Light and Power Company
appeared before the city council and asked for per-
mission to give up the present franchise of the
Sunny Valley Light and Power Company under
which it is now operating, and that they be given
a new franchise entitling said company to raise
its rate for the reason that it is not operating

at a loss. The mayor appointed Councilmen, F. A. Connally, A. F. Chidlers and F. J. Rathiff, to investigate said matter and report on the 17th day of June, 1918.

A. F. Chidlers, a member of and representing the Committee appointed at the last meeting for the purpose of devising a plan to secure pure water, &c., offered his report and moved that same be accepted, which is as follows:

"The Committee appointed to investigate and report on the condition and nature of the water furnished to the city of Pikeville, after making due investigation begs to report that it finds the water being furnished filthy and unfit for use, and recommends that the Mountain Water Company make such repairs and improvements as are necessary to furnish pure water to the inhabitants of said city."

(signed) A. F. Chidlers."

J. C. Clevinger seconded Mr. Chidlers motion that said report be accepted. Upon roll call the vote was as follows: A. F. Chidlers "yea", J. C. Clevinger "yea", Alex Elliott "yea", F. J. Rathiff "yea", F. A. Connally not voting. A majority of the votes being cast in favor of accepting said report, the mayor declared same accepted and discharged the committee.

A. F. Chidlers moved that a committee be appointed to draft an ordinance carrying this report into execution, and that said Committee report at the special meeting of June 17, 1918. J. C. Clevinger seconded said motion. All members present voted in favor of said motion except F. A. Connally not voting. The mayor declared said motion carried.

The mayor appointed as members of said committee Councilman, A. F. Chidlers, and citizens, J. E. Chidlers and J. B. Stratten.

An account was presented in favor of Call Bros. Hardware Company in the sum of \$152¹⁵. The mayor appointed F. G. Connally, J. C. Clevinger and F. J. Rathiff as a Committee to investigate said account and ascertain whether or not various items are chargeable to the city of Pikeville or individuals.

A. L. Rathiff be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$25⁰⁰ for salary as city attorney for month of May, 1918.

E. B. Coleman be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$75⁰⁰ for salary as chief of police for month of May, 1918.

Lilburn Dye be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$12⁰⁰ for working six days as special policeman per order of police judge.
