

Second Street.

East side C. H. Evans, - make repairs.
Dr. G. H. Hughes and J. M. York must clean up and repair buildings and entrances to same, so as to keep the horse and cow manure from scattering out on to the side walk and street.

Pike Avenue.

North side, from second street to east side of livery stable - new walk. This walk must be kept clean of manure in front of the livery stable property, also.

East side, from second street to third street, - new walk.

Scott Avenue.

Following named property holders on north side: J. A. Scott, Mrs. Liza Steel Shaver, Harry Syck, Osta Steel, and all other property holders on north side of Scott Avenue down to the end of the street pavement, - new walks.

South side of Scott Avenue, the following named property holders fronting on said Scott Avenue: George Pinson, James Sawards, also James Sawards property between the alley at Fifth Street and Linton Fivette property; Linton Fivette property; South side of Scott Avenue must make repairs, new walk, except Linton Fivette.

Seventh St.

West side - John W. W. property, new walk.

East side - All property holders between Clin Street and Scott Avenue, new walks.

Sixth Street.

West side - Doc Bill Johnson.

East side - Isaac Clevinger, A. J. Jackson, W. D. Sutton - new walks.

Fourth Street.

East side - George Pinson, Roscoe Jarow, the Linda Bowles property, - new walks.

Clin Street.

North side: all property holders from fourth street to the end of pavement at north line or side of Ed Picklesimer, - new walks.

South side: Railroad property from Auxier Avenue at fourth street to end of pavement at Picklesimer lot, - new walk.

Third Street.

Tom Williamson, Nellie Rathoff, property formerly owned by Joel Childers, Dixie George, Mrs. Marsha Clin, Mrs. Reathdy Owens Musick, - new walks.

Auxier Avenue.

North side: E. E. Fivette, new Bottling Company, Bill Huffman, First Baptist Church, Mrs. Fivette, new walks. In front of Bill Huffman's warehouse the pavement was carried up to the property line, which is now a good and sufficient side walk, if kept clean; otherwise same will have to be torn up and build side walk and curb.

Division Street.

East side: Bowles property from north line First Street to south side of second street, - new walks.

C. D. O. Ry. yard, - from east side of Division St. to West side of Pike Avenue. This is necessary on account of so many wagons and drays entering this yard and coming out carrying mud on to the pavements, - new pavement. All of the above is subject to the approval of the city engineer."

J. C. Clevinger moved that said report and recommendations be accepted and approved and that same be enforced. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows: J. C. Clevinger, ~~acted~~ "yes"; Alex Elliott, "yes" and R. Thompson "yes." The mayor declared same carried.

The mayor appointed A. L. Rutledge to see that said order is enforced.

At a regular meeting of the Common Council of the city of Pikeville held in the city hall on the 7th day of April, 1915, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, Alex Elliott, R. Thompson and J. C. Clevinger.

J. C. Clevinger moved that the city consent to a sale of the city property now being used as an alley, which is located immediately back of the property of N. Starkey in West Pikeville and recommended that the mayor appoint three men in conjunction with Mr. Starkey to fix the price of same and ^{that} a deed of conveyance be made from the city of Pikeville to N. Starkey, covering the footage or surface. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, upon roll call the vote was as follows:

J. C. Clevinger, "yes"; Alex Elliott, "yes" and R. Thompson "no". As a majority present voted "yes" the mayor declared same carried.

The mayor appointed Stony Amick, Alex Elliott and A. L. Rutledge to negotiate the deal.

J. C. Clevinger, Alex Elliott and R. Thompson appointed as a committee to investigate the condition of the city fire department and its needs, made the following report, which is as follows:

"To the mayor of Pikeville and to the city Council:
Gentlemen:

Your committee on fire apparatus makes the following report:

First. They recommend the purchase of a fire wagon drawn by horses and with the necessary equipment to properly man same.

Second. They recommend the purchase of a pair of fire horses to pull said wagon, and wish to report in this connection that the horses could be put to use in keeping the streets in proper shape in hauling sweepers and hauling away the refuse. They recommend the purchase of two sets of harness, one heavy set for work and one light set for use nights.

Further recommend the appointment of a chief of the fire department or putting the same in some official's hands and make that party responsible for all the fire apparatus hose etc., so that the equipment will be in good working order.

Further recommend the organizing of a fire company or companies.

Further recommend the organizing of a fire police to have charge during any and all fires.

J. M. Natcher be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$24.00 for salary and services as city clerk for March, 1919.

J. C. Clevinger moved that the street committee investigate the condition of pavement on Hibbard Street with reference to water standing on same and to arrange for proper relief of same. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

J. C. Clevinger moved that a side walk be constructed in front of Presbyterian School property on College Street and property of Mrs. Hope Wellman, connecting the side walk now in front of Presbyterian School property with side walk in front of property of J. F. Pawley. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, which carried unanimously.

City assessor, John Mullins, tendered his resignation in writing as city assessor of Pikeville, which is as follows: "I, John Mullins, Assessor of the City of Pikeville, hereby resign as such assessor, to take effect immediately.

J. C. Clevinger moved that said resignation be accepted. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, which carried

unanimously, and the mayor declared said office vacant,

E. M. Thornburg be and he is hereby allowed the sum of \$90⁰⁰ for salary as deputy policeman for March, 1919.

At a regular adjourned meeting of the Common Council of the City of Pikeville held in the city hall on the 12th day of April, 1919, the following were present: Mayor, J. L. Morgan, and Councilmen, J. C. Clevinger, Alex Elliott, R. Thompson and W. P. Call.

The mayor appointed W. P. Call, J. C. Clevinger and Alex Elliott to hire a man to list the property in the city and also to hire a man to make up the assessors' books after the city is listed.

J. C. Clevinger moved that P. B. Stratton, George W. Green and Walter Hatcher be granted the privileges set out in the following order and that said order be spread at large on the minute book. Alex Elliott seconded said motion, which carried unanimously, and which is as follows:

"The city engineer, having given specifications for the building of side walks fronting E. W. Street, Walter Hatcher and P. B. Stratton, on the West side of South College Street, and it appearing that there is an embankment on the back side of said side walk, ranging in elevation up to about four feet, and a retaining wall is necessary to prevent the bank from falling in upon said street and side walk, and whereas, the said property owners have agreed to erect said retaining wall, and keep same in repair at their own expense, and to erect same on the back side and abutting on said side walk, it is ordered, and the said property owners aforesaid are hereby authorized (at their own expense) to erect said retaining wall, alongside the back of their said side walk, and in the event it becomes necessary to widen the street or pavement or to widen the side walk, whereby the said retaining wall is required to be removed, then the material placed in said wall may be removed by the said property owners.
